Today's Mass Readings: The SECOND SUNDAY of CHRISTMAS

Sirach 24: 1-2, 8-12; Psalm 147; Ephesians 1: 3-6, 15-18; John 1: 1-18

First Reading: "Wisdom speaks her own praises". Christians understand Wisdom as Christ, and this passage as describing how Wisdom (= Christ) makes its dwelling in Israel. Christ is present "in the holy Tabernacle", that is to say in the Temple in Zion (= Jerusalem), and of course is present in the holy Tabernacle in our churches.

Psalm: a psalm of praise, giving some of God's deeds which are deserving of our praise.

Second Reading: if today's *Gospel* is profound, this passage is one of the most beautiful in all scripture, with a depth and resonance unsurpassed in Christian praise of God.

Gospel: the famous beginning, or Prologue, of *St John's Gospel*. *John* identifies Jesus Christ with the Word of God, through whom everything was created, and who is a light overcoming the darkness. *John* is analysing the significance of Jesus, as one commentator has put it, 'from a transcendent and eternal vantage point'. John (the Baptist) was Christ's forerunner and witness. One could spend eternity meditating on this passage!

Solemnity of the Epiphany of the Lord - Wednesday (6th)

Wednesday is a Holyday of Obligation (or would be if we still had the Obligation), recalling the visit of the Wise Men to the Christ-child. This is the first time it has not fallen on a Sunday since the Bishops transferred it back to the proper date. Holy Mass as follows:

St Thomas's: 8:00am (Latin), 9:30am, 8:00pm. All three will be livestreamed. There is no 12:00 noon Mass.

Holy Trinity: 10:00am.

St Bernadette's: 11:00am.

St Joseph's: 6:00pm. There will be NO Mass on Thursday at St Joseph's.

St Thomas' School
