Today's Mass Readings: Second Sunday of the Year

17th January 2021

1 Samuel 3: 3-10, 19; Psalm 39; 1 Corinthians 6: 13-15, 17-20; John 1: 35-42

The **First Reading** - the calling of Samuel to be a great prophet - is chosen to shed light on the calling of the disciples in the *Gospel*. Like Samuel, the disciple of Christ is called to be a spokesman for God.

Like Samuel (and the disciples in the Gospel) we recite the Psalm to indicate our willing acceptance of the call to do God's will.

Second Reading: this begins a series of readings from St Paul's *First Letter to the Corinthians*. As our bodies are temples of the Holy Spirit, we should avoid fornication, which "is to sin against your own body".

Although Year B is the year of Mark, as St Mark's Gospel is short, on some Sundays like today the **Gospel** reading is from John. Today we hear John's account of the calling of the first disciples, but as usual with John the main point is not history but theology: this is a summary of Christian vocation and discipleship. Is Jesus truly the teacher (rabbi) and Anointed One (Messiah) whom you follow wholeheartedly?

COVID Restrictions

Under the recently announced restrictions you may leave home to attend Mass, as places of worship are allowed to remain open, but do not mingle with people outside your household bubble.

Some parishes have had to close, at least for a while, either because the priests have COVID or are having to isolate or because of a lack of stewards. At the moment we are able to continue with the normal Sunday and weekday Masses, and Fr David is most grateful to the various stewards in the four churches for enabling this.

DO NOT come to Mass if you have COVID or COVID symptoms, or if you are shielding, quarantining, or isolating. Masses at St Thomas's will continue to be livestreamed via the parish website.

Please sanitise hands on access and egress, and maintain a <u>2 metre</u> distance at all times between you and another person who is outside your household. Face coverings must be worn unless exempt; this is now law.

The churches will be well ventilated (so dress warmly!).

Please keep up the fervent prayers for God's help during the pandemic and a swift end to the spread of the coronavirus.
