Today's Mass Readings: SECOND SUNDAY of EASTER

11th April 2021

Acts of the Apostles 4: 32-35; Psalm 117; 1 John 5: 1-6; John 20: 19-31

First Reading: the earliest Christians soon got down to the practical implications of being the new People of God. Witness to Christ and His resurrection was supremely important, but also they had a strong sense of responsibility for each other, and so they had a real desire to share and to support one another.

Psalm: the response, "give thanks to the Lord for he is good, for his love has no end", which is verse 1 of the psalm, pretty much sums up what our response to the resurrection of Christ should be.

Second Reading: right belief in Jesus as the Christ, like love, is the mark of the one born of God.

Gospel: we get so distracted by the doubting of Thomas that we can easily miss the main significance of this episode, namely Christ sending the Twelve (actually only Eleven at the time) out on their apostolic mission, and giving them the gift of the Holy Spirit, in particular to forgive (or retain) sins. The apostles will, of course, receive the fulness of the Spirit at Pentecost.
