Today's Mass Readings: THIRD SUNDAY of EASTER

18th April 2021

Acts of the Apostles 3: 13-15, 17-19; Psalm 4; 1 John 2: 1-5; Luke 24: 35-48

First Reading: Peter preaches that the People of God "must repent and turn to God". 'Repent' might just mean to change one's mind, but 'turn to God' means to change one's life.

Psalm: peace, good sleep, and safety come only from God, when we remember to pray to him. To be at peace with oneself is to be at peace with God.

Second Reading: best of all is not to sin, but if we do sin Jesus Christ is the sacrifice that takes our sins, and those of the whole world, away, And, if we do not keep God's commandments, we cannot say we know God.

Gospel: the closing scene of Luke's Gospel contains two significant points. First, as Christ's resurrection appearances make clear, Jesus has risen in a new body, one which belongs in both heaven and earth; it is a transformed, risen body, not simply the old body resuscitated.

Secondly, Christ explains that the role of the Church is to preach "repentance for the forgiveness of sins to all the nations". Just as after His Baptism Christ first preached the Gospel of repentance, so too after His resurrection it is repentance and forgiveness which are emphasised as the main component of the Church's preaching.
