#### Parish Men's Group meetings

Pope Francis in an Apostolic Letter (Patris corde) released on 8<sup>th</sup> December 2020 proclaimed a Year of Saint Joseph. The Holy Father wrote of the impact of Covid-19 and how it has helped us appreciate the importance of ordinary people who, though far from the limelight, exercise patience and offer hope every day. ## Today's Mass Readings: FOURTH SUNDAY of EASTER

2<sup>nd</sup> May 2021

Acts of the Apostles 9: 26-31, 17-19; Psalm 21; 1 John 3: 18-24; John 15: 1-8

First Reading: not surprisingly when Saul - the former persecutor of the Christians - arrived in Jerusalem he was regarded with suspicion and fear. But Barnabas showed himself to be truly Christian, believing the best of Saul and not holding his past actions against him.

Psalm: the end of the psalm the Lord quoted on the cross, which begins "My God, my God, why have you forsaken me?". The psalm which begins with a sense of desertion and uncertainty ends with a triumphant song of praise for the Lord's mighty deeds.

Second Reading: faith, truth and love all go together: and love is not just words or thoughts, but "something real and active".

Gospel: previously in John the Lord had revealed Himself as the bread which sustains life. Now, in the metaphor of the vine - in which He compares Himself to the vine and His disciples to its branches - He makes Himself known as not only the sustainer but also the origin and source of true or real life, a life which can only be had by disciples from and in union with Him.
