Today's Mass Readings: ELEVENTH SUNDAY (Year B)

13th June 2021

Ezekiel 17: 22-25: Psalm 91: 2 Corinthians 5: 6-10: Mark 4: 12-16. 26-34

First Reading: Ezekiel predicts God's restoration of Judah, using the imagery of planting a cedar tree. These Old Testament texts provide the background for Jesus' words in the Gospel.

Psalm: this psalm, which has been described as 'the song of a happy man', picks up the image of the cedar tree from the First

Second Reading: for the next few Sundays we hear St Paul's Second Letter to the Corinthians. It seems that the church in Corinth was beset by various problems, including disunity, and Paul had to write to them twice. In today's extract the contrast between our present, bodily desires and our future fulfilment in Christ is typical of St Paul.

Gospel: Jesus speaks to the crowds about the kingdom of God in parables. Parables are little stories, which reveal some aspect of God and his kingdom, and which invite us to reflect upon them and apply them to our own situation. The parables of the seed growing of itself and of the mustard seed should give us hope and encouragement in our efforts at spreading the Good News. Fr David
