Today's Mass Readings: NINETEENTH SUNDAY (Year B)

8th August 2021

1 Kings 19: 4-8; Psalm 33; Ephesians 4: 30 - 5: 2; John 6: 41-51

First Reading: Elijah the prophet - who is escaping his enemies by going to God's holy Mount Horeb, or Sinai - is sustained in his 40 day journey by a messenger from God, who gives him food and water. Likewise God sustains us in our earthly pilgrimage with the nourishment of Christ's body and blood.

The Psalm is one of thanksgiving to God for answering the humble man's prayers. But notice the puzzling verse "Taste and see that the Lord is good", a phrase which really only makes sense when used in the Eucharist.

Second Reading: a classic piece of Pauline writing: a Christian disciple must put off vices and put on virtues, almost like a change of clothes. It is also typical of Paul that he draws out the practical consequences of his theological teaching.

The Gospel continues the series of readings from the 'Bread of Life discourse' in John chapter 6. In Jewish teaching manna often referred to divine word or instruction, so when Jesus says "I am the bread of life" he could mean that He is the revelation of God and God's teaching. However, as the discourse goes on Christ speaks of 'the bread of life' as "my flesh", and it becomes increasingly apparent that He is referring to the eucharistic bread.

Notice how closely the wording in the last verse is to Matthew's account of the institution of the Eucharist (Mt 26: 26-28): "Take, eat; this is my body; ... drink ... this is my blood". Fr David
