





#### Today's Mass: SECOND SUNDAY of ADVENT (C)

Baruch 5: 1-9; Psalm 125; Philippians 1: 4-6, 8-11; Luke 3: 1-6


First Reading: Baruch, here making a rare appearance in the Lectionary, was probably written during the exile in Babylon. This Reading is a very poetic and prophetic message of consolation, foretelling the restoration of Jerusalem, the holy city.

**Psalm:** this is the song of the exiles returned from Babylon. For us it foreshadows the song we shall sing when we return from our exile 'in this vale of tears' to our true homeland, heaven.

Second Reading: we prepare for the second coming ("the Day of Christ") by spreading the Good News, increasing in love for each other, and improving our knowledge (of the things of God), so as to become "pure and blameless".

The **Gospel** for each year on this Sunday focuses on St John the Baptist. Notice how *Luke* firmly places John in both history (with the rather detailed dating) and in theology (with the reference to Isaiah 40: 3-5). St John the Baptist is the 'voice crying in the wilderness, preparing a way for the Lord' predicted by Isaiah.

## From the Desk of the Parish Priest **Parish Information Document** (part 3)

ast time I referred to the difficulties of Ecumenism. It is worth adding that there are a number of ecumenical groups which do work together, including Sevenoaks Counselling and the Loaves & Fishes Food Bank. Things are ecumenically better in some of the villages like Otford and West Kingsdown.

Section 14 is entitled 'General Administration of the **Parish'**. This is mainly about a Parish Council. When I came to the parish there was a local committee at Most Holy Trinity, and I have established similar committees at St Joseph's and St Bernadette's, although the latter has yet to meet formally because of the pandemic.

When I came, my priority had to be establishing a Finance Committee - as mandated by Canon Law - and getting catechists and others DBS checked - as required by civil law. The creation of a Parish Council was to be the next step, but it has been on hold since the first lockdown. I will most probably return to this in a future article on this page, exploring how we might best institute a Parish Council.

This section of the Handover Form also enquires about a Deanery Pastoral Council, which again we have not got in this Deanery.

Section 15 is about **Finance**. The Parish uses the diocesan Accounts IQ system, an online system for real time accounting of monies received and expended. We do have safes (details of which I am not going to publicise in case burglars are reading!). The safe at West Kingsdown is so tricky to open that you need a doctorate in higher mathematics to do so!

**'Financial Administration'** is the next Section. We have a Parish Finance Committee, which includes a representative from each of the 'outstations'. A financial statement is published, in the Newsletter and on noticeboards, every year. We have five bank accounts: a Current A/c, a Reserve A/c, and one each for the 'outstations'. We also have a good sum on loan to the diocese, which brings in a (very) modest amount of interest. Although people donate more and more by Standing Order or via the card machine we still have people who count the cash collections. As and when

we exit the pandemic we shall probably require some more. Strangely, the Form doesn't seem to enquire about auditing the Accounts, but they are checked annually by an Independent Examiner.

Next comes **Gift Aid.** Sean Corrigan does sterling work maintaining our Gift Aid records, using a diocesan online system called Giftwise. The Gift Aid refund each year is a considerable part of our income.

Section 18 asks about **personnel**. Our parish employees are paid via the diocesan Payroll, and nobody is paid in cash. They are all entitled to work in the UK.

Section 19 - **'Parish Property and Assets'** - goes on for pages, exacerbated in our case by having six premises (the four churches, Presbytery, and Parish Centre). The Parish also owns a plot of woodland in Hildenborough.

Quinquennial Inspections were held in March 2018 at St Bernadette's and in August 2018 at St Thomas's, Most Holy Trinity, and at the Parish Centre. St Joseph's, not yet having had its fifth birthday, does not yet get a Quinquennial Inspection.

Gas and electrical surveys, the lightning conductor survey at St Thomas's, and Health & Safety Inspections are all up to date. We are very grateful to Maria Boehne, who keeps an eye on these things via another diocesan online system, the Health & Safety Toolkit.

The three Chapels of Ease are all in good condition, and only routine maintenance is required. St Thomas's is generally good for its age, although attention will have to be given to the Sanctuary flooring, the lighting, and replacement of the benches which are nearing the end of their life. I remain ever hopeful of a legacy to pay for these!

It is the Parish Centre which is in need of a serious refurbishment. The plan is to create a Working Party of stakeholders (the groups which use the building) and draw up a plan. Amanda Buttinger has agreed to convene this. You will be hearing more about this in the future.

## **RECENT STATEMENT** BY THE BISHOPS

#### **Migrants' death**

Following the tragic death of at least 27 migrants in the Channel – the worst-ever migrant tragedy in that body of water - Cardinal Vincent Nichols said:

"The terrible loss of so many lives in the Channel is a tragic summons to action. This event illustrates graphically both the ruthless evil of the traffickers and the desperation of those trying to escape poverty, conflict or persecution in search of a better life.

Every one is a child of God, with an innate dignity and worth. Focussed international cooperation, safe routes to sanctuary and joint efforts to tackle poverty are all needed in the face of a global flood of desperate humanity."

Bishop Paul McAleenan, Lead Bishop for Migrants and Refugees, also commentated on the tragedy:

"Everyone knew refugees were crossing the Channel in unseaworthy craft. It happened vesterday and the day before and in increasing numbers in recent weeks. It will happen again tomorrow and will continue unless determined concerted action is taken immediately. Concern for and a desire to protect refugees from lifethreatening danger is our duty at all times, not only when a tragedy occurs.

Yesterday's loss of life is a reminder of the desperation of those who are willing to risk everything as they seek a better life in a desire to escape appalling experiences and circumstances. A remedy needs to be found immediately to prevent more tragedies and, at the same time, address the underlying causes which force refugees to flee their homeland, war, poverty, persecution and climate change need to recognised and addressed. The depth and sincerity of belief in the value and sanctity of every human life will be seen in the response to what happened. May those who perished rest in peace."

On Saturday 25<sup>th</sup> September, the day before the World Day of Migrants and Refugees, Bishop Paul McAleenan led a service of reflection and prayer on the seafront in Dover. The group gathered to pray at the Migrants Memorial on the front that was installed in memory of those who have lost their lives seeking sanctuary in the UK.

#### 'Assisted killing'

Politicians in Jersey have voted in favour of the proposition of legalising assisted suicide in the States of Jersey. On 25<sup>th</sup> November 2021. 36 voted in favour. 10 against with three absent. There will be further debate in 2022 and a draft law could be voted on in 2023.

In reaction to this 'in principle' decision, the **Bishop of Portsmouth**, the Right Rev'd Philip Egan, said: "I was shocked and saddened by the results of the vote on euthanasia and assisted suicide in Jersey. It demonstrates a woeful lack of interest in protecting the most vulnerable people in our society. If passed, it would also change fundamentally the role of doctors and medical staff.

However, this is only the first step in the process of legalising 'assisted suicide'; as such, we will continue to scrutinise and challenge any proposed legislation in the months ahead.

The Catholic Church is clear that we can never assist in taking the life of another, even if they request it. Killing people and committing suicide is against God's law. All human life is a gift to be safeguarded from conception until natural death, and we reiterate our call for continuing investment in high quality palliative care, in order to preserve the dignity of some of our most vulnerable, at such difficult moments in their lives."
