



Today's Mass: FIRST SUNDAY of LENT (Year C)

Deuteronomy 26: 4-10; Psalm 90; Romans 10: 8-13; Luke 4: 1-13

First Reading: an early creed or confession of faith, recalling the rescuing of the people of God in the Exodus. The 'wandering Aramaean' refers to Jacob.

Psalm: this is a rare occasion when the psalm refers to the Gospel, not the First Reading. The devil sneakily quotes it in the third temptation!

Second Reading: we comply with St Paul's exhortation that our lips should 'confess that Jesus is Lord' during the 'Lord, have mercy' (the 'Kyrie, eleison') at Mass.

Gospel: Jesus is tempted by the devil in the wilderness for forty days. Pope Benedict XVI wrote that at the heart of these temptations "is the act of pushing God aside because we perceive him as secondary, if not actually superfluous and annoying, in comparison with all the apparently far more urgent matters that fill our lives".





From the Desk of the Parish Priest

f the Paschal Triduum and the Fifty Days are the radiant centre of the liturgical year, Lent is the season that prepares the minds and hearts of the Christian people for a worthy celebration of these days. The scriptural readinas of the Lenten season find their deepest sense in relation to the Paschal Mystery that they prepare us to celebrate. (Homiletic Directory §57).

During Lent I will examine the Gospel Readings for each Sunday, bearing in mind that the Lectionary Readings for Lent have been selected in order to help us prepare for the great celebration of Easter. It is easy for us to see the connection between the forty days Jesus spent in the desert and the forty days we spend in Lent. Indeed, if we observe Lent unstintingly we are as it were participating in the forty days of Jesus and in his experience there of fasting and being tempted.

Today's Collect uses the striking phrase "through the yearly observances of holy Lent" and this reminds us that Christ is present and at work in His Church in this holy season, and it is His purifying work in our penitential practices which gives our self-denial its saving significance.

The Gospel on the First Sunday is always the temptation of Christ in the desert at the beginning of His public ministry: in this Year C we hear Luke's version. The number forty is meaningful. Israel passed forty years wandering in the desert, from Egypt to the Promised Land. But, in contrast to the rebellious Israelites who provoked God by their disobedience in their forty years, Jesus was totally obedient to the Father's will and fulfils Israel's vocation perfectly. Forty recalls also Moses' forty days on Mount Sinai before he received the tablets of the Covenant.

That the temptations in the forty days took place in the desert or wilderness is also significant. The desert, with its wild beasts and other dangers and with no food, is the opposite of the Garden of Eden. Christ, by triumphing over the Devil and later enduring His passion and death, is thus undoing the sin of Adam and Eve.

The Devil tries three temptations, which at root are about pushing God aside, regarding God as irrelevant compared with our own desires and ideas, surely a temptation very prevalent today in different forms. The temptations do not directly invite Jesus - and us today - to do evil; that would be too obvious. Rather, they pretend to show us a better way, but moral

posturing is not better than following God's way.

"If you are the Son of God" - we shall hear these words again from the mocking bystanders at the foot of the Cross - is challenging Jesus to provide proof as to who He is. Do we too demand proof? If you exist God, show yourself; give us evidence, Jesus, that you are the Saviour.

The first temptation is "turn this stone into a loaf". Is there any more powerful argument against the existence of God than world hunger? Should we not turn to human concepts and ideas, Marxism perhaps, to solve world hunger? And yet, just as God gave the people manna in the desert so too Jesus fed the people with bread in the miracle of the multiplication of the loaves and continues to feed us in Holy Communion.

Secondly, on a mountain the Devil invites Jesus to worship him and He will receive lots of power and glory. Isn't this the mission of the Messiah? By contrast Jesus on the mountain of the Transfiguration says "all authority of heaven and earth has been given to me" (Matthew 28:18). Christ's glory derives from His obedient passion and death and subsequent resurrection and it gives Him authority in heaven. To put it another way, the kingdom of heaven is completely different from the passing kingdoms of this world.

Finally the Devil guotes Scripture to lure Jesus into a trap. Jesus quotes Scripture (Deuteronomy 6:16) in response. If we try to test God, like a laboratory rat, we shall never find him or his reality.

What does Jesus' victory over the temptations give us? Pope Benedict (in Jesus of Nazareth) gives us the answer: "the answer is very simple: God." God alone is the true reality, not all these worldly distractions. God alone is to be worshipped. In this "venerable and sacred time" (Prayer over the Offerings) we try to rid ourselves of human distractions and selfish desires so as to put God, his word and commandments, at the true centre of our lives.
