



Today's Mass: SECOND SUNDAY of LENT (Year C)

Genesis 15: 5-12, 17-18; Psalm 26; Philippians 3: 17 - 4.1; Luke 9: 28-36

First Reading: God enters into a covenant with Abram, the man of faith, a very early direct encounter of a man with God.

Psalm: a psalm of confident faith and trust in God.

Second Reading: some people make earthly things like food their God. But if we remain faithful to Christ He will transfigure our bodies into copies of His glorious body.

Gospel: the Transfiguration of Jesus on the mountain. This is, first, as *Luke* says, a prayer event; it shows visibly what happens when Jesus prays to his Father: His being becomes one with the Father as He becomes 'light from light'. (The same thing happened to Moses when he talked to God on Mt Sinai in *Exodus* 34.) Secondly, while the white garment and the voice of the Father look back to Christ's Baptism, the reference to Moses and Elijah speaking of what Christ was to accomplish in Jerusalem points forward to the cross (which will, paradoxically, be the moment of His exaltation or glorification).

From the Desk of the Parish Priest

The Gospels of the Sundays in Lent 2

he Gospel Reading on the Second Sunday of Lent is always the account of the Transfiguration. In Luke - as in Matthew and Mark - this stunning scene of the glorious transfiguration of Jesus's body takes place immediately after His first prediction of His Passion: "The Son of Man, He said, is destined to suffer grievously, to be rejected by the elders and chief priests and scribes and to be put to death, and to be raised up on the third day" (Luke 9:22).

It is after this that Jesus takes three disciples - Peter, James, and John, the same three who will be with Him in the agony in the garden - to the top of a high mountain, and there divine glory bursts forth from His body. Moses and Elijah appear, conversing with Jesus. Then a cloud of divine presence, like the cloud on Mount Sinai, envelops Jesus and the disciples, and from the cloud comes a voice: "This is my Son, the Chosen One. Listen to him".

Clearly, cross and glory belong together. The whole Old Testament, represented by Moses and Elijah, indicates this, and the Transfiguration points forward to Christ's death and resurrection, which will be His glorification. Today's Preface beautifully summarises this:

For after he had told the disciples of his coming Death

on the holy mountain he manifested to them his glory,

to show, even by the testimony of the law and the prophets,

that the Passion leads to the glory of the Resurrection.

The old Law was given to Moses on a mountain, Mount Sinai. Now Christ, on Mount Tabor, is giving a new Law. And the new Law, the law of the Gospel, is that it is the way of the Cross which will lead to glory.

Also, here we are at the heart of the Trinitarian mystery. Jesus is accredited by the voice of God the Father as God the Son. The Son is here revealed as the 'Light from light' of which we speak in the Creed. Here Scripture reinforces Tradition and Tradition reinforces Scripture.

In the context of the three synoptic Gospels the Transfiguration marks a turning point. Previously Jesus has been teaching, preaching and performing miracles in the northern area of Galilee. After His Transfiguration he turns towards Jerusalem, where He

will suffer Crucifixion before His Resurrection. The vision of Christ's true glory and divine nature thus strengthens and fortifies the disciples before the rigours and trials ahead.

In the context of Lent the Transfiguration fortifies us in our Lenten discipline, first by pointing forward to the glory of Christ's Resurrection which we shall celebrate at Easter. The Prayer over the Offerings makes this point: "may this sacrifice ... cleanse us of our faults and sanctify your faithful in body and mind for the celebration of the paschal festivities". And secondly by reminding us that Jesus will share His resurrection glory with the Baptized. As St Paul puts it in today's Second Reading (Philippians 3:21): "he will transfigure these wretched bodies of ours into copies of his glorious body".

As we prepare to come forward in the Communion Procession today the Church gives us in the Communion Antiphon the very words of the Father heard in the Gospel: "This is my beloved Son, with whom I am well pleased; listen to him". What the chosen disciples saw and heard at the Transfiguration now converges with our reception of the Lord's Body and Blood at Mass. While still on earth the three disciples saw the divine glory shining in the body of Jesus. While still on earth the faithful receive His Body and Blood and as we partake of the things of heaven we hear the Father's voice.

Luke tells us the purpose of Christ's ascent of the mountain: to pray. The Transfiguration is a prayer event. It displays visibly what happens when the Son prays to the Father: there is a profound interpenetration of each other, and one doesn't doubt that the Holy Spirit is also present. Jesus Christ, as ever, is the model and exemplar of prayer.

If we, likewise, approach God in prayer, especially in the great prayer we call the Mass, and if we embrace willingly the Way of the Cross, then we shall gradually, gradually enter into the full depth of the mystery of Jesus.

ST JOSEPH'S COMMITTEE MEETING

This is a summary of the Minutes of the meeting of the Committee held on Thursday 17th February. Present were Fr David, Antoni Offert (Chair), Margaret Briggs (Treasurer), Nick O'Connor and John Foley (Secretary).

Margaret reported on the financial situation. St Joseph's - like the other two Chapels - has its own modest bank account, part of the parish accounts which in turn are part of the Archdiocesan accounts, as required to meet Charity Commission regulations.

The closing balance as at 31.12.2021 was £1,062.96.

The plans for the building of a three storey office/residential block next door, where Kent Aluminium currently are, were examined. As it happened the diocesan surveyors came at the same time as the meeting, to inspect the building so as to be able to respond to any damage to St Joseph's from the building work.

The committee confirmed that rotas were in place for flowers, Mass readers, and Extraordinary Minister of Holy Communion visits to Westbank Care Home and home visits, and that arrangements are set for opening the church and setting up the Altar for Mass. Another EMoHC may be needed for visits to the housebound.

Now that the Franciscan Capuchins are assisting regularly on Sundays there should be more consistency in the priest celebrants on Sundays.

Initial plans were made for social events, including the St Joseph's Quiz Night and Supper. Help from several parishioners would be needed for the Supper now that the UCM has disbanded.

Gardening is being carried by Margaret and volunteers, and Mark Johnson mows the grass with the new mower. Slates have come off the roof, and Margaret would obtain a quote for repairs from a local roofing company. (In fact, the subsequent storms caused further damage, and the diocesan builders are to inspect the building, to ascertain what is needed.) The front doors need revarnishing.

A new organist is required, and Mark Johnson will train any new Altar Servers.

Finally the one remaining detail of the new build is the external crucifix. This has been on hold during the pandemic, but Fr David will now pursue this.
