

Today's Mass: PALM SUNDAY of the PASSION of the LORD (Year C)

Luke 19: 28-30; Isaiah 50: 4-7; Psalm 21; Philippians 2: 6-11; Luke 22: 14 - 23: 56

Gospel: Jesus enters Jerusalem as the Messiah (this is the significance of the details such as the donkey and the colt). But He is not universally welcome; the Pharisees complain, and Jerusalem is the city which kills the prophets (see *Luke* 13:34).

First Reading: this prophecy of the suffering servant, innocent but not retaliating, would be fulfilled by Christ, as we shall hear in the Passion Reading.

Psalm: although the suffering servant feels abandoned he ends up praising God. Similarly, Christ's passion ended in His triumph; His suffering is the way to His glorification.

Second Reading: Christ humbly accepted death on a cross, but precisely because of that God raised Him high so that everyone would acknowledge Him as Lord.

Passion: Luke's account of Christ's Passion. At the words 'he breathed his last' all kneel and pause a moment. Please join in the crowd parts.



From the Desk of the Parish Priest

The Gospels of the Sundays in Lent: Palm Sunday

oday the Gospel is read at the beginning of Mass, at the Blessing of Palms. This is adapted from a reflection originally composed for the Order of Knights of The Holy Sepulchre of Jerusalem.

Blessed City, Heavenly Salem,
Vision dear of Peace and Love,
Who, of living stones upbuilded,
Art the joy of Heav'n above,
And, with angel cohorts circled,
As a bride to earth dost move!
Urbs Beata Jerusalem (office hymn for the Dedication of a Church)

Today we recall Jesus Christ's triumphal entry into Jerusalem. Not counting the three kings who went to Jerusalem before going on to Bethlehem on their pilgrimage to the infant Jesus (*Matthew* 2:1), the first pilgrim to Jerusalem of whom we have an account is the (name unknown) 'Bordeaux pilgrim' in 333, who seems to have found most of the churches in the holy places under construction.

Most notably, some 50 years later Egeria made a pilgrimage, and seems to have found the inchoate Liturgy of the Church under construction, especially the Holy Week Liturgies. She describes a procession on Palm Sunday from the Mount of Olives back down into Jerusalem, beginning at 5 o'clock in the afternoon:

"all carry branches, some from palm and some from olive trees. In this way the bishop is led down in exactly the same way as happened with the Lord. Everyone is on foot, even the older men and women. They escort the bishop, singing the responses and walking slowly so as not to tire those in the procession. As a consequence it is evening by the time they reach the church, yet they still have the Service of Lights, then the prayer at the Cross, before the dismissal".

Since then countless pilgrims over the centuries have entered Jerusalem, in the footsteps of the Lord. And not only pilgrims: Jerusalem has been entered by conquerors on at least 36 occasions. Most famously Field Marshall Viscount Allenby, having vanquished the Ottoman Turks in the First World War, entered Jerusalem humbly (and wisely) on foot, through the Jaffa Gate, in 1917.

We cannot all go on pilgrimage to Jerusalem this Sunday. So on Palm Sunday we have our Processions into our Churches, much as happened in Jerusalem in Egeria's day. But, it is worth remembering that every time we attend Holy Mass we are - liturgically - entering Jerusalem as a pilgrim. This is perhaps seen clearly in mediaeval English churches with their elaborate rood screens, through which the priest and his assistants pass to enter the Sanctuary, which represents Jerusalem - the place where Christ's sacrifice was and is offered - and which is a but a copy of the real sanctuary in heaven (see *Hebrews* 9).

Every church building is intended to be a sacramental building, both a reminder of the Temple in Jerusalem with its Holy of Holies and an image of the heavenly Jerusalem to which we journey as pilgrims. The church building is meant to be an image of the heavenly Jerusalem described in *Apocalypse* 21. In England & Wales, the queue for Holy Communion is (somewhat stereotypically, one might think) the form of reverence prescribed by our bishops, but the Communion Procession is not simply a way to get forward for Holy Communion: it is symbolic of each Christian's pilgrimage, 'from sin and self to union with God' as Cardinal Hume once put it.

That Holy Mass is a sacramental participation in the liturgy in the heavenly Jerusalem is at the heart of the Second Vatican Council's teaching on liturgy: in our earthly churches "we sing a hymn to the Lord's glory with all the warriors of the heavenly army" (Sacrosanctum Concilium §8).

Thank you

I'd like to say a very big thank you for your support this year. In these unusual times, your support has been critical to keeping the parish financially afloat.

You have protected the Parish

One of the things that continues to help our financial position is that a clear majority of the parishioners who Gift Aid now do so by standing order. A big thank you to all of you who have moved to doing a Standing Order. I'm keen to continue this trend for two reasons: firstly it has protected us financially during the pandemic. Secondly (more selfishly) it simplifies the back-office administration.

For parishioners who use the weekly envelopes.

I'm continuing to consolidate the Weekly Envelope numbers. If the number on your box was above 50 you will be receiving a new number. By consolidating the numbers, we cut down on the number of boxes that we have to order from the printer. It reduces the cost to us and we don't throw away surplus boxes unnecessarily. Your boxes of weekly envelopes are now ready to be collected at the back of church. Please take your box home.

For parishioners who have standing orders

A small bundle of second collection and special collection envelopes are now ready to be collected at the back of church. Each bundle is in an envelope with your name on. Please find your envelope and take it home. As technology moves on, some of you are now finding it more convenient to do additional bank payments for second collections or are using the machine at the back of St Thomas's. Even so please take your envelopes home so that we do not miss any Gift Aid from your generosity at the second collections.

Mea Culpa in advance

With four 'Mass centres' in the parish, I try to make sure that the correct box or bundle goes to the right place. It's more of an art than a science. I have a long list which I keep and update each year where I have made a mistake in the past. So, if I get it wrong, please let me know and email me at sevenoaksgac@rcaos.org.uk or ring me on 07771945321. I'll sort it out and get your envelopes to you.

How significant is the tax relief to the parish?

Everyone's contribution whether small or large is important. In the 2020/21 tax year we were able to claim back from the tax authorities over £35,000. It is a big part of our income and allows us to fund our four Mass centres and contribute to the diocese.

Please consider joining the Gift Aid scheme.

If you **don't** currently Gift Aid and are a taxpayer, the parish as a charity is able to reclaim the basic tax you have already paid on anything you give to the Parish. We can then claim on all gifts like Mass offerings or even the First Communion Programme. If you think that's a good idea, please just do it. Take a moment to complete the Gift Aid Form; you only need to do it once. You can put the completed forms in an envelope in the offertory collection or through the Presbytery door.
