

Today's Mass: FIFTH SUNDAY of EASTER

Acts 14: 21-27; Psalm 144; Apocalypse 21: 1-5; John 13: 31-33, 34-35

Ukrainian refugees arriving in the parish: volunteer help needed

We are expecting a Ukrainian family of five to arrive in the next few weeks and live locally in a house owned by a Catholic charity, of whose Trustees Fr David is the Chair; he and the other Trustees have been working with another local charity SWR (Sevenoaks Welcomes Refugees) to accommodate them. We expect to house up to ten refugees in this property.

The family of five who are coming comprise a mother, a paediatrician who has already got a job in a local hospital, her two little children and three middle aged relatives; all female. The husbands and sons remain in Ukraine as part of the local defence force. The mother is the only one who speaks English.

We need volunteers to help support this family. Refugees generally need help in multiple ways to settle into a new life in a different country: taking them shopping, teaching them English (no prior training required for native speakers), showing them the local area, assisting with transport etc. If you think you can help please contact Fr David or Ben Andradi: ben.andradi@gmail.com.

From the Desk of the Parish Priest

Baptism of Desire

Fr David answers another parishioner's question.

After my recent article about Baptisms with the wrong words or practice being declared invalid, someone asked me: what happens to those who were invalidly Baptized? Does it mean that they can't go to heaven? The answer is the doctrine of Baptism of desire.

The Church has always followed the Lord's clear teaching that Baptism is necessary for salvation (eg *John* 3:5) and we know of no other way that assures entry into the beatific vision I described last week. But, the Church has always held the conviction that those who die for the faith (by martyrdom) before they can be Baptized are regarded as having received the Baptism of blood. Likewise catechumens who die before they are Baptized are regarded as having received the Baptism of desire. We can apply this doctrine to those invalidly Baptized.

There are a number of different scenarios. Suppose someone was, as they thought, Baptized, and quite possibly received Holy Communion, was Confirmed, got Married and even received the Anointing of the Sick, and led a devout life, and has died, but in fact their Baptism was invalid. Such a person was hardly responsible for the invalid Baptism, and they went through the other Sacraments in good faith. We can apply the doctrine of Baptism of desire and thereby be reassured of the destiny of their eternal soul.

A second scenario is that someone is in the same situation as the first but has not yet died. If they have no knowledge of their invalid Baptism, and most likely no hint that there might even be a problem, then we can apply the same solution. We can hardly expect people to go round worrying that their Baptism might have been invalid, and in most cases there would be no way to prove it either way; videoing of Baptisms is a very recent phenomenon.

Third, suppose someone was invalidly Baptized and later does discover it, like the priest who watched a video of his own Baptism. This category divides into two. The priest realised the gravity of the situation, and arranged to be Baptized, Confirmed and Ordained properly. This is, obviously, the correct course of action, and puts the situation right. Any Baptisms he carried out - provided they were done properly - were valid, because anyone can Baptize, not just the Clergy.

In Holy Matrimony it is the couple who are the ministers of the Sacrament. And those who attended his Masses did so in complete good faith, so they are not to be regarded as culpable. If someone discovers that his/her Baptism was not conducted validly that person should seek the advice of a priest and be prepared to be Baptized according to the mind of Christ and the rules of the Church.

However, suppose someone discovers his/her Baptism was not valid but does nothing about it. This category, again, divides into two. If someone finds out they were not, after all, validly Baptized but continues to receive the Sacraments (especially the Eucharist) nonetheless, he/she is committing the grave sin of sacrilege. *1 Corinthians* 11:27 is the origin of this doctrine: *"Whoever eats the bread and drinks the cup of the Lord unworthily will have to answer for the body and blood of the Lord."* Remember that a person who is (knowingly) in this situation not only can but should attend Holy Mass on a Sunday. But to receive Holy Communion is an offence against the Lord Himself, because Holy Communion is the Lord's Body and Blood. Quite apart from the charge that someone is in this situation but pretends all is OK is being hypocritical, Canon 916 says that a person 'conscious of grave sin should not receive the Body of the Lord without previous Confession', and if the person were to go to Confession, if he/she withholds the information that they are not Baptized any absolution would itself be invalid.

And what if someone discovers he/she was not validly Baptized but has previously turned away from Christ and His Church or uses this discovery as a pretext to leave the Church? I would not wish to be in their shoes when it comes to the Day of Judgement



2021 PARISH FINANCIAL OVERVIEW

The Financial statement on the back page shows a summary of the Parish Account for 2021 compared to 2020. Please do review it. The Parish Finance Committee is keen to be as transparent as possible as we take the stewardship of our financial resources seriously. During the year ending December 2021 the Parish made a small operating loss before major works costs of £171, compared to an operating loss of £5,234 in 2020. This was a fantastic recovery of our financial position post Covid.

Operating Income

Operating Income was £201,269 in 2021 compared to £184,336 in 2020. The Offertory was £3,756 higher. Parishioners are still switching to regular donation by Standing Order which assures the parish of a more assured steady income. Income benefitted from a one-off legacy of £10,000 which is earmarked for maintenance works at St Bernadette's.

Operating Expenditure

Operating Expenditure was £201,110 compared to £189,570 in 2020. Supply priests cost 37% more in 2021 compared to 2020 as the churches reopened gradually whilst Covid restrictions were being lifted. Office costs were 54% higher in 2020 as the committee took the decision to purchase a new photocopier. The new photocopier will bring savings to the Parish over the next few years and a full cost benefit analysis was carried out to support the purchase. Diocesan assessments were lower in 2021. The assessment is based on income in the previous year. Other areas of expenditure remain more or less in line with 2020 and were within budget. During 2021 the major works cost was the replacement of the two boilers in the Presbytery. The majority of planned maintenance took place during 2020 when it was convenient to conduct repairs in the churches during lockdown.

2022 Forecast

During 2022 we are forecasting to make an operating break-even point. This will depend on the generosity of our parishioners and careful financial management on behalf of the Finance Committee. We are aware of the potential impact of utility bills on our bottom line and have done our best to ameliorate our position by making long term commercial contracts.

Unlike most other parishes in our Archdiocese, who are having a very hard time financially, we are in a good situation primarily because of all your generosity and support. We are fortunate to have around £470k of liquid assets at the year end. Most of this arose from the sale of Giswill, former home of Canon Bailey, in 2020. Our intention is to keep £250k as a reserve for a rainy day, spend £80k this year on the new garage at St Thomas's, the car park at Otford and new lighting in St Thomas's, leaving £140k for new projects.

We thank you, the Parish community, for your continued generosity to our Parish, in keeping our ability to continue to celebrate our faith together, and support the Archdiocese of Southwark, during this most difficult of year.
