

Today's Mass: CORPUS et SANGUIS CHRISTI

Genesis 14: 18-20; Psalm 109; 1 Corinthians 11: 23-26; Luke 9: 11-17

**First Reading**: Melchizedek, referred to here as "a priest of God most High", brings bread and wine, a prefiguring of the Eucharist. Melchizedek is mentioned in Eucharistic Prayer I and in today's Responsorial Psalm.

**Psalm:** as Son Christ shares in God's supreme dominion, but He exercises His power in priesthood.

**Second Reading:** the institution narrative in every Eucharistic Prayer is based on the Gospels but also on this passage which, written some twenty years after Jesus died, is the earliest testimony to the tradition. The first memorial acclamation is taken from this passage.

**Gospel:** the feeding of the Five Thousand. Moses had fed the Israelites in the desert (*Exodus* 16) and Elisha had fed the people with more than enough (*2 Kings* 4). Jesus also feeds the people but His miracle exceeds the prophets' miracles.

Like all the Gospels *Luke* clearly presents this miracle as having eucharistic overtones, as we can discern from the verbs he uses to describe Jesus' actions: as at the Last Supper (and as every priest does at every Mass) He takes the bread, blesses it, breaks it, and gives it.



From the Desk of the Parish Priest

# **Holy Mass**



s today is the Solemnity of Our Lord's Body and Blood (Corpus et Sanguis Christi) it seems appropriate to give an overview of the Mass.

#### The Eucharist

The Eucharist is counted as a Sacrament of Initiation, and is the third of these; the first two are Baptism and Confirmation. The Eucharist is, in the words of the Second Vatican Council, the "source and summit of the Christian life" (Lumen Gentium §11). It is the sign and cause of our communion with God and with one another (which is why we are unable to offer Holy Communion to those who have withdrawn from Communion with the Catholic Church). It is also a uniting with the heavenly Liturgy and an anticipation of eternal life (see the Catechism of the Catholic Church §1326); in other words you had better get used to the Mass in this life, else you will struggle in heaven!

# **Scriptural Foundations**

The Mass is firmly Scriptural. In the Old Testament there are various pre-echoes of it, including Melchizedek, the High Priest who "brought out bread and wine" (Genesis 14:18; see today's First Reading), the unleavened bread at the Passover each year (Numbers 9), and the manna from heaven (Deuteronomy 8:3). The underlying concepts of Mass, including sacrifice, thanksgiving and communion with God are all derived from the Old Testament.

In the Gospels there is the multiplication of the loaves (*Matthew* 14: 13-21; 15: 32-39; see today's Gospel), the first miracle at Cana (water into wine: *John* 2: 1-12), the Last Supper and Christ's command to "do this in memory of me", Jesus' discourse at Capernaum in *John* 6 (" I am the bread of life"), and the disciples recognising Jesus in the breaking of bread at Emmaus (Luke 24: 13-35).

In the New Testament see the reference in *Acts* 20:7 to the breaking of bread, but the earliest account of the command of Christ in is *1 Corinthians* 11.

## Different names

The Mass is so important that over the centuries it has been known by a number of different names. Eucharist comes from the Greek for giving thanks (to God). The Lord's Supper is a term derived from *Mark* 14 and 1 *Corinthians* 11: 17-34. The Breaking of Bread was a technical term used in the early Church (in the Emmaus story in *Luke* and in *Acts* 2:42 etc). It can be called the Assembly (Synaxis in Greek) because it is celebrated amid the assembly of the faithful (see 1 *Corinthians* 11: 17-34). The Divine Liturgy refers to the Church's principal service and worship.

It is called the Holy Sacrifice because it makes present the one sacrifice of Christ the Saviour (*Hebrews* 13:15, *1 Peter* 2:5). The Most Blessed Sacrament describes it as the sacrament of sacraments. The strangest word is Mass. This is the most commonly used word, but its origin is a mystery. It may come from the sending forth (ie our mission) at the end of Mass - "Ite, Missa est" - but we don't actually know that is where it comes from.

#### **Holy Mass**

The earliest witness to the Mass, as we would recognise it, is in approximately 155 AD in the *Apologia* 1 written by Justin Martyr. It developed over the centuries, until the Council of Trent (1545 – 1563) formally codified the words and actions, in Latin of course. Sometimes non-Catholics allege that the Catholic Church invented its understanding of the Eucharist then and thus subverted the 'purity' of the first Christians, but concepts like the Real Presence go right back to the early Church; Trent simply put it down in writing.

Vatican II (1962 – 1965) opened up the use of the people's mother tongue, and designated the two-fold structure of the Liturgy of the Word and the Liturgy of the Eucharist (Sacrosanctum Concilium §56). The Council also wanted "devout and actual participation of the faithful" (Sacrosanctum Concilium §50), more use of the Bible, and greater access to communion under both kinds.

For validity, bread and wine must be used (no Ribena!), and it must be celebrated by a Sacerdos (= Bishop or Priest). Every Catholic, unless impeded by illness, lack of transport etc, has an obligation to attend Mass on Sundays and Holydays.

## CORPUS CHRISTI PROCESSION

At St Thomas's use the Procession leaflets

After the Post Communion Prayer, KNEEL. As the Blessed Sacrament is placed on the Altar:

O Sacrament most Holy,
O Sacrament divine,
All praise and all thanksgiving
Be every moment thine. (x3)

Those throwing the rose petals precede the Priest; others please follow. During the Procession hymns (such as Sweet Sacrament Divine, Alleluia, sing to Jesus, and Lord Jesus Christ will be sung; take a hymn book).

After the Blessed Sacrament is placed on the Altar:

Tantum ergo Sacramentum Veneremur cernui: Et antiquum documentum Novo cedat ritui: Praestet fides supplementum Sensuum defectui.

Genitori, Genitoque Laus et jubilatio, Salus, honor, virtus quoque Sit et benedictio: Procedenti ab utroque Compar sit laudatio. Amen.

- V. Panem de caelo praestitisti eis, Alleluia.
- R. Omne delectamentum in se habentem, Alleluia.

The Priest sings a Prayer.

After the Blessing with the Blessed Sacrament, repeat the Divine Praises after the Priest:

Blessed be God.

Blessed be His Holy Name.

Blessed be Jesus Christ, true God and true Man.

Blessed be the Name of Jesus.

Blessed be His Most Sacred Heart.

Blessed be His Most Precious Blood.

Blessed be Jesus in the Most Holy Sacrament of the Altar.

Blessed be the Holy Spirit, the Paraclete.

Blessed be the great Mother of God, Mary most Holy.

Blessed be her Holy and Immaculate Conception.

Blessed be her Glorious Assumption.

Blessed be the name of Mary, Virgin and Mother.

Blessed be St. Joseph, her most chaste spouse.

Blessed be God in His Angels and in His Saints.

As the Blessed Sacrament is reposed in the Tabernacle, a hymn such as Soul of my Saviour is sung.
