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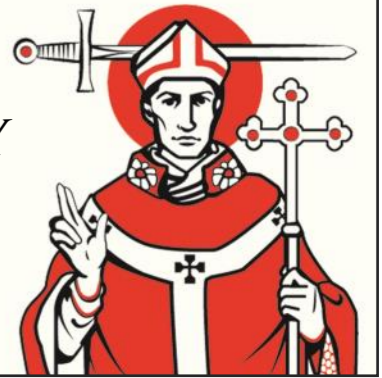

Today's Mass: THIRTEENTH SUNDAY

1 Kings 19: 16, 19-21; Psalm 15; Galatians 5: 1, 13-18; Luke 9: 51-62

First Reading: Elijah the prophet calls Elisha to follow and succeed him. This story is chosen as today's First Reading because of the parallel between Elisha's desire to say farewell to his parents first and the desire of the last mentioned disciple in the Gospel to do the same.

Psalm: we are confident that God 'will show us the path of life'.

Second Reading: freedom is not freedom to do as one likes (self-indulgence); rather it is freedom to do deeds of love prompted by the Spirit.

Gospel: Jesus and His followers turn towards Jerusalem. For Luke this is not so much geographical as theological: the holy city of Jerusalem will be the climax and focal point of Jesus' saving death and resurrection. And the call to follow Christ overrides everything else.

Like all the Gospels *Luke* clearly presents this miracle as having eucharistic overtones, as we can discern from the verbs he uses to describe Jesus' actions: as at the Last Supper (and as every priest does at every Mass) He takes the bread, blesses it, breaks it, and gives it.

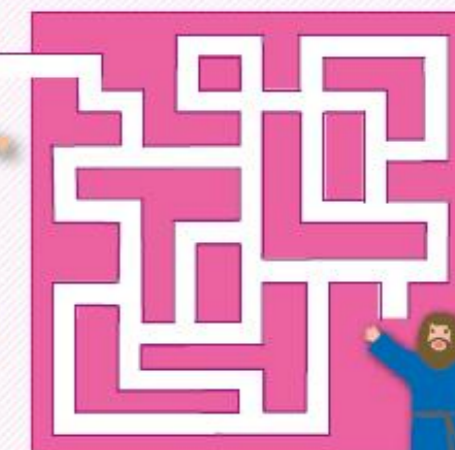

From the Desk of the Assistant Priest

Come Holy Spirit

As many of you know, we recently had a visit to this parish from Dr. Ralph Martin, an internationally renowned Catholic author, whose national tour I had become involved in co-ordinating. If you did not manage to make any of his talks, I really do commend you to check out some of his books, especially *Fulfilment of All Desire*.

It was a privilege to get-to-know Ralph during his visit and I learnt a lot from what he had to share. However, perhaps the most important insight I gained was into the importance of the Holy Spirit.

Ralph pointed out what a crucial difference Pentecost made to the Apostles. Even after having witnessed the Resurrection, the Scriptures indicate the first Christians were still living in fear of the Jews (cf. John 19.19, 26), still holding onto doubts (cf. Matt. 28.17b) and still looking for an earthly, political salvation (Acts 1.6). It was the coming of the Spirit which broke them free, filling them with courage to live for Christ and go out into the world proclaiming eternal salvation in Him.

However, Ralph made another important point - many baptised and confirmed Catholics do not seem to be living the joy of this Pentecostal experience. Many still seem to be afraid to share their faith, or are lacking the courage to fully live for Christ. In essence, he said, they are living as 'pre-Pentecostal' Christians.

How can this be?

Whilst it is clear that the grace of the Holy Spirit is given in the sacraments, the Church also teaches that the fruitfulness of the sacraments - that is the effectiveness in the life of the one receiving - is dependent on personal readiness to receive those fruits (*Catechism*, § 1128).

St. Thomas Aquinas suggests that a number of things can effectively block the fruitfulness of the sacraments in our lives.

Lack of repentance

"Now so long as a man wills to sin, he cannot be united to Christ...Wherefore Augustine says in his book on Penance that "no man who has the use of free-will can begin the new life, except he repent of his former life." (Summa Theologiae III, q. 68 art. 4)

Lack of faith

"[R]ight faith is necessary for Baptism, because, as it appears from Romans 3:22, the justice of God is by faith of Jesus Christ." (Ibid, art. 8)

Lack of intention to live a new life

"Just as, according to Augustine, he who has the use of free-will, must, in order to die to the old life, "will to repent of his former life"; so must he, of his own will, intend to lead a new life, the beginning of which is precisely the receiving of the sacrament." (Ibid, art. 7)

The challenge and the opportunity

Am I joyfully living the new life of a post-Pentecostal Christian, not in fear, or, for the things of this world, but for the life to come? Do I have the courage to share that message of eternal life with others?

These are challenging questions - but if the answer is 'no' then the conclusion is that I am probably not living the life Christ desires for me.

The good news, however, is that it is never too late to open my heart anew. I do not need to receive the sacraments again, I simply need to seek to remove whatever obstacle is making them unfruitful.

And the even better news, is that the Holy Spirit is here to help. If I have not really repented, I can ask Him for the grace of deep compunction; if I need the gift of faith, I can seek it. When we *"pray without ceasing"* (cf. Thess. 5.16-18) the Lord will help us in our need - after all, if we really want the sacraments to be fruitful in our lives just think how much He wants to them to be!

CALLED TO HOLINESS
CATECHESIS FROM THE WORLD MEETING OF FAMILIES 2022

CHOSEN BY GOD TO BECOME HOLY

What is our family calling? St. Paul - called by the Lord to make a radical turning point in his life – (cf. Acts 9:1-28) – could answer as follows:

«Blessed be the God [...] [who] chose us in him, before the foundation of the world, to be holy and without blemish before him. In love...» (Eph 1:3-4).

A family is born from the decision of a man and a woman to begin an experience of life in common together, supported by the Grace of Christ. When this occurs, married life, full of novelties and new challenges to face, becomes for the spouses, as the rite of Marriage says, the new path towards their sanctification and, consequently, a privileged path towards holiness.

In the same way, family life, entwined with relationships, sometimes complicated, and with relationships that are not always easy, becomes a particularly suitable and favorable context for contemplating the action of the Spirit of God, who can convert human hearts, change their attitudes and make the members of the family capable of loving as Christ loves.

HOLINESS: A CALLING FOR ALL

«For I, the LORD, am your God; and you shall make and keep yourselves holy, because I am holy» (Lv 11:44).

Pope Francis in his Apostolic Exhortation *Gaudete et Exsultate*, the third of his pontificate, encourages each person to respond to his or her own call to holiness. God does not call everyone anonymously and generically, rather he extends a personal call to each person.

Let us consider some reflections in which the Holy Father expresses a clear invitation to not be afraid to accept the personal call to holiness.

« I like to contemplate the holiness present in [...] God's people [...]: in those parents who raise their children with immense love, in those men and women who work hard to support their families, in the sick [...]. Very often it is a holiness found in our "next-door neighbours", those who, living in our midst, reflect God's presence. We might call them "the middle class of holiness» (7).

«all the faithful, whatever their condition or state, are called by the Lord – each in his or her own way – to that perfect holiness by which the Father himself is perfect» (10).

«"Each in his or her own way" [...]. The important thing is that each believer discern his or her own path, that they bring out the very best of themselves, the most personal gifts that God has placed in their hearts (Cf. 1 Cor 12:7) rather than hopelessly trying to imitate something not meant for them» (11).

«To be holy does not require being a bishop, a priest or a religious. We are frequently tempted to think that holiness is only for those who can withdraw from ordinary affairs to spend much time in prayer. That is not the case. We are all called to be holy by living our lives with love and by bearing witness in everything we do, wherever we find ourselves. [...] Are you married? Be holy by loving and caring for your husband or wife, as Christ does for the Church. Do you work for a living? Be holy by labouring with integrity and skill in the service of your brothers and sisters. Are you a parent or grandparent? Be holy by patiently teaching the little ones how to follow Jesus» (14).

«This holiness to which the Lord calls you will grow through small gestures» (16).

«May you come to realize what that word is, the message of Jesus that God wants to speak to the world by your life. [...] The Lord will bring it to fulfilment despite your mistakes and missteps, provided that you [...] remain ever open to his supernatural grace, which purifies and enlightens» (24).

In the distant past, as well as in more recent times, it is possible to find children, adolescents, young people, widowers and married couples who can show us a path to holiness for every age and state of life: think, for example, of little Laura Vicuña, who became a saint at the age of twelve, the young Pier Giorgio Frassati, or Therese of Lisieux's holy parents.

This idea of the neighbourhood saint fits us, it is very close to us, we can relate to it. Perhaps even we can possibly encounter some of them?
