

Isaiah 66: 10-14; Psalm 65; Galatians: 14-18; Luke 10: 1-12, 17-20


First Reading: Jerusalem, the holy city, is depicted as a mother and as the centre of celebration when the Messiah comes.

Mass Intentions

Each time he offers Mass the priest can offer it for a specified intention, such as for someone who has died, for good health for a sick person, or in thanksgiving for graces received. These are the Intentions listed in the weekly Mass Sheet and usually announced at the beginning of Mass. This ancient practice benefits both the faithful and the person for whom prayer is asked (the Mass is the greatest prayer of intercession).

PARISH AND OTHER NOTICES

To book a Mass Intention use one of the envelopes available by the newsletters (or any envelope); write the Intention on it, any particular date or place you wish it to be offered, and your name and contact details if you want the details to be confirmed. Put your donation inside (£10 is a typical amount) and hand it to one of the priests or pop it through the Presbytery letterbox. Alternatively you can call in to see Magda in the Parish Office.

Holy Souls Masses

You may have seen the wall box in St Thomas's Entrance marked 'Holy Souls'. Every so often it is emptied, and (by diocesan rule) every £10 represents one Mass for the Holy Souls in Purgatory who have no one to pray for them. These Masses tend to be offered by the priests when they are concelebrating, so are not necessarily announced.

It is a worthy tradition to maintain. As well as an act of charity towards the deceased, we hope that the parish will offer Mass for us when we have departed this life! If you attend Holy Mass at Most Holy Trinity, St Joseph's or St Bernadette's just put your donation in a envelope marked 'Holy Souls' and send it in with the Sunday collection.

Vocations

Please remember in you prayers Stephen Srikantha and Machir Ahmed who will be commencing formation for the Priesthood in the Archdiocese this September. The Archbishop writes: "It is prayer which brings about growth in the Christian community, from which are raised particular vocations, which are signs of hope for the world".

Also please pray for Michael Etuka, Joseph Gulliford and Alan MacDonad who will be Ordained Priests for the Archdiocese in July.

Sunday Obligation

From Pentecost Sunday onwards the Bishops reinstated the Sunday Obligation to attend Mass on Sundays and Holy Days. Parents applying for a place at a Catholic school (including St Thomas' School) need to complete a Supplementary Form, on which the Parish Priest validates frequency of Mass attendance, as was the case prior to the pandemic. Priority in admissions is given to those who attend Mass most frequently. Parents who will be applying early in 2023 for a place at St Thomas' School should be aware of this.

From the Desk of the Assistant Priest

eceiving Holy Communion is, at were, the high point of Mass. Holy Communion is the ultimate expression of our ■ communion, our unity, both with God and with each other. It is the last of the four-fold Actions of the Mass which the priest performs: he takes the bread or wine, blesses it, breaks it (the bread), and gives it. Notice the word 'giving': we receive Holy Communion when we are given it by the Priest Celebrant who is acting in the person of Christ; we never 'take Holy Communion'.

What, then, are the practical implications of this? How do we receive Holy Communion?

First, we form the Communion Procession. It may seem a peculiarly British thing to do, to queue for Holy Communion, but the Procession to the Altar is more than getting from your pew to the Communion point. The Communion Procession symbolises our journey in this life to the eternal messianic Banquet of the Lamb, which Mass foreshadows: it reminds us that we are on a pilgrimage. At Sunday Mass when numbers are greater, please come forward in two lines: this makes administering Holy Communion more efficient.

We do not normally have ushers motioning people forward row by row. This is deliberate, because not everyone may receive Holy Communion. Those who are not permitted to receive Holy Communion because of grave sin, those not properly disposed, those who have not observed the fast before Holy Communion, children who have not yet received their First Holy Communion, non-Catholic Christians (who choose not to be in Communion with the Catholic Church), and non-Christians may not receive Holy Communion.

Small children may be brought with you as you come forward for Holy Communion. Otherwise, noncommunicants - under the Bishops' COVID protocols should not come forward in the Communion Procession.

The *General Instruction* can be found at the beginning of the Roman Missal. Paragraph 160 states that 'In the Dioceses of England & Wales, and of Scotland Holy Communion is to be received standing, though individual members of the faithful may choose to receive Communion while kneeling'. §161 states that the communicant 'receives the Sacrament either on the tongue or, where this is allowed, in the hand, the choice lying with the communicant'.

Receiving Holy Communion

In Southwark Communion in the hand is permitted. The choice of standing or kneeling, receiving on the tongue or in the hand, belongs to the communicant or, for children their parents. It is not for the priest or Extraordinary Minister to impose one way or the other. It is also for you to decide if you wish to receive under both kinds or not when the Bishops restore the chalice.

An act of reverence is required, which is kneeling if you kneel. If you receive standing §160 recommends that 'the faithful bow in reverence before receiving the Sacrament'. You should do this while the person in front of you is receiving Communion. If you receive the Precious Blood when it is reinstated, move over to form another queue, and receive the chalice when it is offered; take a small sip and return the chalice carefully. Self-intinction (where you dip the host into the chalice) is not permitted, because you receive, not take. Holv Communion.

When the Minister says 'The Body of Christ' or 'The Blood of Christ' reply 'Amen'. This is your expression of faith in the eucharistic presence of the Lord; it also affirms 'that we are the Body of Christ, that is the Church' (St Augustine, Sermon 272).

Afterwards return to your place, and continue reverently praying and giving thanks to God. The Missal prescribes a period of 'sacred silence'. The time of Holy Communion at Mass should above all be one of reverence, as God is among us in this special way. But reverence is not limited to the Communion Rite: it begins at home as we prepare for Mass and carries on after Mass as we 'go in peace, glorifying the Lord by our life'.



REPORT FROM THE MOST HOLY TRINITY COMMITTEE

These reports are not Minutes, which may not be terribly exciting and which may contain confidential matters. Rather they are a report back of the main items of interest. Speak to the Committee Secretary if you would like to see the Minutes.

The Most Holy Trinity Committee met on 16th March. There were present Barry Authers (Chair), Mary Scott (Treasurer), Sarah Harrison, Frank Quinn, Anne Knight, Antony Tyler, Gilly Fenner (Secretary), Lonnie Christophers and Fr David.

Various

Two gazebos have been offered by Tony Pluck for the use by the church, and they will be stored in a box.

Recording of Masses etc to a laptop is now possible: speak to Barry Authers to utilise this facility.

A new heater for the Sacristy will be obtained (the previous one was condemned).

Children's Liturgy of the Word is restarting, co-ordinated by Magda Wiacek.

Finances

The local accounts are now part of the diocesan NatWest system. There has not been much activity recently.

Garden

Tidy up sessions have been very successful. The mole problem is being addressed. The Rosary Garden is finished and is well used.

Car park

Otford Builders Merchants make a donation in return for their employees parking their cars in the car park. There is a good rapport in the event of Funerals etc. The current revenue from the car park is £2,700, a welcome sum.

A quote for resurfacing the car park was identified as the best quote; this was subsequently agreed by the Parish Finance Committee. At the moment we are awaiting diocesan Finance Committee approval before commencing this work.

Ecumenism

Sarah Harrison tabled a report, mentioning the ecumenical gatherings on Palm Sunday and the Queen's Platinum Jubilee ('Hymns & Pimms'). Fr David remarked that ecumenism seems more thriving in Otford than in Sevenoaks.

Village Fete (28th May)

It was agreed to participate, and in the event it proved most successful, not least in making a presence at this important village event. Antony Tyler arranged for a banner to be made, advertising some of the things undertaken in and by the parish.

Future events

The St Edith's Devotions will be on Sunday 18th September (her actual Feast Day).

This year's Ride & Stride is expected to be on 10th September (last year's raised £595 for MHT).

A social event – perhaps a Quiz Night on Saturday 24th September – is planned.
