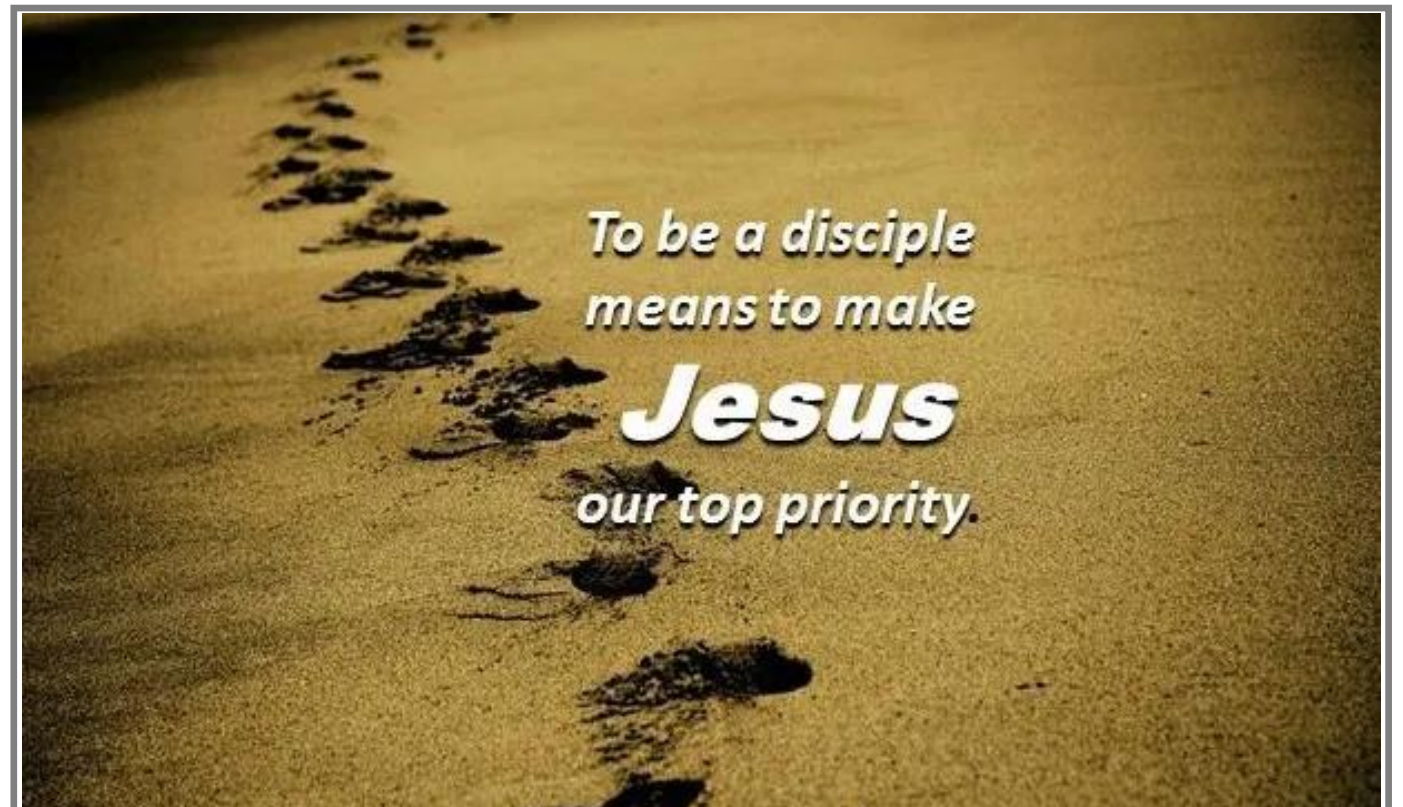

### *Today's Mass: TWENTY-THIRD SUNDAY (Year C)*

*Wisdom 9: 13-18; Psalm 89; Philemon 9-10, 12-17; Luke 14: 25-33*

**First Reading:** it is difficult enough to understand earthly things; how much more difficult it is to understand God's ways. We can only know of God's ways because he sent the Holy Spirit to us.

**Psalm:** a plea for wisdom, for understanding of our condition.

**Second Reading:** this is the only reading from Paul's *Letter to Philemon* in the entire three year Sunday cycle. Paul returns Onesimus to his owner Philemon, but now that Onesimus is a Christian he is to be a brother rather than a slave. Paul has converted both Onesimus and Philemon to faith in Christ.

**Gospel:** Christ tells us that discipleship makes demands, so we should not enter into it lightly or without serious thought or planning.

## Pilgrimages

### Going on Pilgrimage

On my recent holiday in northern Portugal I came across a Shrine of Our Lady of which I had never heard, namely the Sanctuary of Nossa Senhora dos Remedios (Our Lady of Remedies) in Lamego; this devotion dates from the 16<sup>th</sup> century. It set me thinking about pilgrimage.

#### Pilgrimages in History

Pilgrimages have long been a part of human experience, from Adam and Eve who made a journey (somewhat reluctantly, admittedly) from the Garden of Eden onwards. One thinks in the Old Testament of Abraham, called by God to leave home and settle in Canaan (*Genesis 12*), Jacob's pilgrimage (*Genesis 35*), and of course the Jewish people's journey from Egypt to the Promised Land (*Exodus*). Jesus Himself made pilgrimages to Jerusalem, including the time His parents left Him behind.

Once Constantine recognised Christianity in 314 AD Christian pilgrimages took off, starting with his mother Empress Helena's pilgrimage to the Holy Land in 326. A little later an unnamed pilgrim called the Bordeaux Pilgrim wrote a full account of his pilgrimage to the Holy Land, as did a woman called Egeria in the 380s.

Besides the Holy Land, other pilgrimage destinations grew up, especially Rome, the place of the tombs of St Peter and Paul, Compostela, the very popular Shrine of St James the Great, and since 1061 in England Walsingham. Following his martyrdom in 1170, the Shrine of our own St Thomas of Canterbury was a much visited place of pilgrimage until the Reformation.

Many pilgrimage places are, of course, particularly associated with apparitions of Our Lady, including Knock in Ireland, Fatima in Portugal, and Lourdes in France, the most visited pilgrimage place in Christianity. Other religions have pilgrimages as well, including Islam (to Mecca and elsewhere), and there are many Hindu and Buddhist pilgrimage sites in and around India.

#### Why go on pilgrimage?

In short, a pilgrimage is a microcosm of our whole life's journey towards God. One definition describes a pilgrimage as 'a journey towards God with a purpose'. It is thus different from a holiday, from a vacation trip. In a pilgrimage we take time out from our everyday life to encounter God, and it is meant to be a life changing experience. Each pilgrimage should be a response to

the never ending call to conversion and a renewal of our interior life of holiness; we return refreshed and renewed in our practice of the faith.

Everyone has a personal reason for going on pilgrimage: some hope to receive special spiritual graces, some want a bodily or mental cure, some have petitions to present to God, some wish to give thanks to God, some are looking to discover their purpose in life. But all share the same search for faith. After a pilgrimage many pilgrims become more fervent in their study of the faith, in their prayers, in their parish work, and in their particular apostolate.

Pilgrimages do not have to be sombre affairs: they can be enjoyed, not least because they afford time for relaxation and for getting to know one's fellow pilgrims better. The handicapped children I went to Lourdes with were sad when the week ended, because they had enjoyed themselves so much and forgotten their troubles.

#### Parish Holy Land Pilgrimage

Next year we shall, God and COVID willing, have a parish pilgrimage to the Holy Land. Of all pilgrimage destinations the Holy Land is the most special: for 2,000 years pilgrims have gone "in a long procession in search of the 'footprints' of God in that land which provided the setting for the earthly life of the Son of God" (Pope St John Paul II), and the magnetism of Jerusalem is undeniable.

Going to the places where Jesus walked brings the Gospels to life and indisputably leads us closer to Jesus. The spiritual fruits of a Holy Land pilgrimage are inestimable. Is God calling YOU to go on this pilgrimage?



## FAITH CELLS LETTER FROM THE CLERGY

Dear Parishioners,

As you hold in your hands the full colour, twelve-page parish newsletter, with which you should be so familiar, you may be getting a certain feeling that the summer is now passing away and things are getting back to normal - at least at Church. Hopefully, those of you who have been away will have been refreshed by the break, and for all of us it will have been a lovely summer - not least enjoying the unusually summery weather; or, indeed, for some, in spite of it.

September typically brings a season of new beginnings in a Catholic parish. The RCIA programme for those interested in becoming Catholic will soon start again; the First Holy Communion programme is beginning to get underway in earnest; and the Confirmation candidates reconvene this week. We will also look forward to seeing the school children resume their visits to Tuesday Masses - all looking a little older; and the many and various parish groups doing so much good, and often unseen, work will start to gather themselves for a new year's programme of activities.

This year, however, we would like to draw your attention to an innovative and very important initiative within our community: PARISH FAITH CELLS. Information about Parish Faith Cells has been trailed across the summer, and so it is hoped that many of you will have heard of this initiative already. If you have not, can we encourage you, very strongly, to take a leaflet from the back of the Church, or visit the Parish website where you can find fuller information?

The idea behind Parish Faith Cells is really very simple - to build up connections. The healthy functioning of a human brain is conditioned by connections between the brain cells and the different parts of the brain. In a similar way the healthy functioning of a Church community is dependent on strong connections between individual members - both with one another and with the Church's head, Jesus Christ. It is hoped that participation in Parish Faith Cells will build up these connections within our parish family.

Those who join a parish cell will commit, for a number of weeks, to getting together with a small group, in order to get to know one another better and deepen friendship by spending time together. At the same time, participants will get to know Jesus Christ better through learning more about and sharing the Faith with one another. The initiative was trialled in the spring, and we have been overwhelmed by the positive feedback from those who took part in the pilot - some testimonies about their experiences are available on the parish website. We are therefore confident in now recommending Parish Faith Cells to all our parishioners.

As things begin to return to 'normal' in our parish, and as we look forward to a year, please God, no longer limited by Covid-19 regulations and lockdowns, we believe Parish Faith Cells will offer our parish a way to grow in vibrancy, faith and love of both our Lord and one another. We really would ask you to consider signing-up, and being part of this exciting new venture.
