

### Today's Mass: TWENTY-FOURTH SUNDAY (Year C) Exodus 32: 7-11, 13-14; Psalm 50; 1 Timothy 1: 12-17; Luke 15: 1-32


First Reading: at Moses' intercession God relents and does not punish the people for turning away from him and worshipping the golden calf instead.

**Psalm**: a psalm which St Paul could have written (see the *Second Reading*): in it we thank and praise God for his mercy in forgiving our sins.

Second Reading: St Paul recounts God's mercy towards him, someone who had persecuted the Church but is now a faithful disciple, with thanksgiving and praise to God.

Gospel: in these three parables with whom do you most identify? Are you like the shepherd, conscientiously searching out someone who has turned away from God and rejoicing at their return? Do you, like the woman, seek out the things of heaven to complete your life? Are you like the younger son, wanting satisfaction in the things of the world, and partly turning away from God? Are you like the father, someone who ignores their status and unconditionally, generously, even foolishly forgives another and welcomes them back? Or are you the elder brother, bearing a grudge and unwilling to accept new developments?

he relics of St Bernadette of Lourdes have begun their two month tour of Great Britain, beginning at Westminster Cathedral. Some 1,700 people attended the opening Mass in the Cathedral, and there were

long queues outside the Cathedral to visit the relics, despite the booking system.

In his homily Vincent Cardinal Nichols said "We pray that all who gather to greet her, to reach out to her in whatever need, will learn the great lessons of her life and witness: that in God's eyes we are precious, no matter our condition; that in the eyes of Mary, we are beloved sons and daughters, whom she gathers under her mantle of consolation and healing; that Mary never abandons us but is with us every step of our pilgrim way through this life; that Mary will always lead us to her Son, Jesus, in whom alone is our fullness and redemption."

The relics will then travel approximately 11,500 miles to every diocese in Great Britain, including stops at Wormwood Scrubs prison in London and the Ukrainian Greek Catholic Cathedral. The relics will be in St George's Cathedral, Southwark between 19<sup>th</sup> and 21<sup>st</sup> October, and they will then be at The Friars, Aylesford here in Kent between 7:00pm on 24<sup>th</sup> October and 1:00pm on 28<sup>th</sup> October. In 2009 the visit of St Thérèse of Lisieux' relics to Britain drew vast crowds, and in 2012 the relic of the heart of St John Vianney toured dioceses in northern England. Pilgrims who venerate St Bernadette's relics – which include rib fragments, kneecaps, and thigh muscle, housed in a decorated reliquary – can receive a Plenary Indulgence if they also go to Confession, receive Holy Communion, and pray for the Pope's intentions.

Bernadette Soubirous was born in 1844 in Lourdes, a remote town in south-western France. In 1858 she experienced visions of the Blessed Virgin Mary. She later joined the Sisters of Charity in Nevers, central France, and died in 1879 aged 35. Once the Church was satisfied the apparitions were genuine the

Shrine in Lourdes was established, and now draws millions of pilgrims each year. Healing is a special charism of the Shrine in Lourdes, and as recently as 2018 the 70<sup>th</sup> miracle was officially recognised by the independent medical panel. On the 150<sup>th</sup> anniversary of the first apparition Pope Benedict XVI said "Mary, appearing to St Bernadette, opened a privileged place to encounter the divine love which heals and saves".

Besides physical healing - and there have over a thousand miracles claimed over the years - Lourdes also provides emotional healing – it is often in caring for the sick and most vulnerable that one finds shared joy and comfort – and psychological healing – as at Lourdes we can discover forgiveness and hope.

Travelling, even to somewhere as relatively near as Lourdes, has been very difficult in the last two years or so, because of the pandemic. Now St Bernadette will instead journey to us, making the grace of pilgrimage available to people in England, Wales and Scotland who might otherwise not be able to go on pilgrimage. As the Relic Tour website puts it: *"We can expect many graces from this visit including healing, conversion and the wonderful discovery of vocation"*.

I will leave the final explanation to Pope Benedict XVI: "By inviting us to venerate the mortal remains of the martyrs and saints, the Church does not forget that, in the end, these are indeed just human bones, but they are bones that belonged to individuals touched by the transcendent power of God. The relics of the saints are traces of that invisible but real presence which sheds light upon the shadows of the world and reveals the Kingdom of Heaven in our midst".



#### EDUCATION SUNDAY (from the Bishops' Conference website)

Education Sunday is one of the oldest Days of Special Prayer in this country's liturgical calendar. Established by the Bishops in 1848, originally on the feast of the Sacred Heart in June, it is now celebrated at the beginning of the academic year. Although long associated with the annual collection for the work of the Catholic Education Service, its main purpose is to celebrate the work of Catholic education and to enable it to continue to flourish with the support of the whole Catholic community.

Catholic education is a precious legacy from our forebears, and a testament to their courage and foresight. In the mid-nineteenth century the Catholic Church in this country was a mainly poor and immigrant community, emerging from centuries of persecution. Education was rightly seen as the principal means of handing on the faith and improving the spiritual, moral, social and cultural lives of the next generation. This year is the 175<sup>th</sup> anniversary of the beginning of State funding for Catholic schools, and the founding of what is now the Catholic Education Service. At that point in history, our Bishops made the education of the poor their top priority and, making huge sacrifices, Catholics set about raising funds and fighting for the right to re-establish the national network of schools and universities which we enjoy today. Catholic education is a tremendous achievement to be celebrated.

The Catholic Church is this country's largest provider of secondary schools and second largest provider of primary schools. Catholic education is by far the largest charitable endeavour of the Church in this country: we give thanks for the many thousands of teachers, lecturers, academics, support staff, leaders, governors, advisers and others who have found their vocation in Catholic education, and without whom this endeavour would be impossible.

Catholic schools continue to be true to their mission: they are more diverse than any other type of school, they recruit disproportionately more children from the poorest areas of the country and still consistently manage to be the highest performing schools in the country.

For Catholic education to continue to flourish, it needs to rely on the continued support of the whole Catholic community. As in previous generations, all Catholics need to be prepared to do their bit to support, promote and defend Catholic education. There are many ways to do this: whether by praying for vocations to Catholic education, responding to consultations or letting your elected representatives know your views, or encouraging a young person to teach in a Catholic school. In that way, we can all ensure together that our Catholic schools and universities will be there to form the next generation.

Saint Thomas Aquinas is a Doctor of the Church, known as the Angelic Doctor. He is aptly the patron saint of academies, schools, universities, students and learning. Pupils and teachers can reflect on the following quote in order to think about what it means to have enlightened minds, be authentic and discover vocation. The Angelic Doctor said:

#### "Three things are necessary for the salvation of man: to know what he ought to believe;

to know what he ought to desire; and to know what he ought to do."

A student's prayer for enlightenment, written by St. Thomas Aquinas:

Come, Holy Spirit, Divine Creator, true source of light and fountain of wisdom!

Pour forth your brilliance upon my dense intellect, dissipate the darkness which covers me, that of sin and of ignorance.

Grant me a penetrating mind to understand, a retentive memory, method and ease in learning, the lucidity to comprehend, and abundant grace in expressing myself.

Guide the beginning of my work, direct its progress, and bring it to successful completion.

This I ask through Jesus Christ, true God and true man, living and reigning with You and the Father, forever and ever. Amen.
