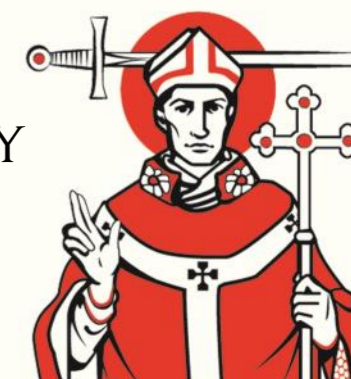

Today's Mass: TWENTY-NINTH SUNDAY (Year C)

Exodus 17: 8-13, Psalm 120, 2 Timothy 3:14- 4:2, Luke 18: 1-8

First Reading: the Israelites only prevail in their battle with the Amalekites when Moses raises his arms. Why is this so? Does it mean his arms are raised in prayer? Old Testament *First Readings* are normally selected to elucidate the *Gospel Reading*, but how does this relate to today's *Gospel*? Do let me know if you can answer these questions.

Psalm: the question in the first verse – “*from where shall come my help*” – is answered in verse 3: “*The Lord is your guard and your shade*”.

Second Reading: Scripture is inspired by God, and so teaches us about God and is the basis for our evangelizing and teaching of the faith.

Gospel: the Parable of the Persistent Widow. The point of the parable is that if even a corrupt judge can be persuaded to do the right thing by someone who pesters him until it happens then God, who is Justice in person and who cares passionately for people, will surely see that justice is done.

From the Desk of the Parish Priest

Prayer 1

I have written about prayer before, but it is such an important subject that I am returning to it, with acknowledgement to the *Irish Catholic Catechism for Adults*.

God's Universal Call to Prayer

"For me, prayer is a surge of the heart; it is a simple look turned toward heaven, it is a cry of recognition and of love, embracing both trial and joy" (Catechism of the Catholic Church §2558, quoting St Thérèse of Lisieux).

This is one of hundreds of descriptions of prayer from throughout Christian history I could have quoted. *"True prayer is nothing but love"* wrote St Augustine. *"Prayer"* said St John Vianney *"is the inner bath of love into which the soul plunges itself"*. Abbot Marmion defined prayer as 'just spending time with God', while St Francis de Sales remarked: *"everyone of us needs half an hour of prayer each day, except when we are busy – then we need an hour"*.

Definitions like these are helpful, but the important thing is not knowing about prayer but actually praying. As the Rule of St Benedict says *"If a man wants to pray, let him go and pray"*.

Scripture: the Old Testament

Scripture reveals the relationship between God and his people as a dialogue of prayer. He constantly searches for us, and God initiates the activity.

Abraham, Isaac and Jacob witness to faith and to prayer. In each case God's call came first and these patriarchs responded in faith and trust, but not without a struggle. Centuries later God called Moses, whose story dramatically illustrates the value of intercessory prayer as he begged God for mercy and guidance for the people journeying to the Promised Land.

Other examples of faith and prayer include the holy woman Hannah, who longed for a child: God answered her petition and she bore a son, Samuel, who became a prophet and judge (see *1 Samuel 2* for her song of praise and joy). Esther was another woman of faith who relied on God in prayer; her prayer and God's response are remembered in the annual Jewish Feast of Purim.

The Psalms

The psalms are a masterpiece of prayer, and *"these incomparable prayers nourished the people both personally and communally"* (Irish Catechism). They were sung in the Temple, in synagogues, in families,

and in individual prayer and are part of the celebration of every Mass, as well as forming the heart of the Liturgy of the Hours. Canticles from other books of Scripture are also prayed at Lauds and Vespers and other offices.

The Prayer of Jesus

The most important example of prayer is obviously that of Jesus Christ Himself. He clearly learnt prayer from Mary and Joseph, and joined in prayer in the synagogue and Temple. But He also had His heavenly Father as the source of His prayer, revealed when He was twelve: *"I must be in my Father's house"* (Luke 2:49).

The Gospels describe the numerous times Jesus went away from the crowds to pray, and in the Garden of Gethsemane He prayed in agony to the Father.

He also taught His disciples to pray, giving us the prayer we call the Paternoster or Lord's Prayer (*Matthew 6: 5-15* and *Luke 11: 1-4*) and validating prayer of petition (*Matthew 7: 7-12*)

In Christ's parable of the tax collector and the Pharisee the tax collector begins his prayer with the words 'God, be merciful to me a sinner', showing humility and repentance (*Luke 18:13*).

Lectio Divina

Lectio Divina is a reflective reading of Scripture leading to meditation on specific passages. It relies on the guidance of the Holy Spirit as the person praying reads a Scripture and pauses to seek out the meaning that God wants to convey through his Word.

Prayer in the New Testament

At Pentecost, after a novena (nine days of prayer) in the Upper Room, the disciples experienced the gift of the Holy Spirit to spread the Good News. The first Christians *"devoted themselves to the Apostles' teaching and to fellowship, to the breaking of bread, and to prayer"* (*Acts 2:42*).

The letters of St Paul show him to have been a man of intense prayer; he frequently praises God for blessings received, makes intercession for graces for the communities he has evangelized, and describes his own personal prayers to God. St Paul calls us to 'pray constantly' (*1 Thessalonians 5:17*).

KING CHARLES III

From the Archbishop: His Majesty King Charles III recently invited senior faith leaders to Buckingham Palace in order to address us. I attach a copy.

Cardinal Nichols said of the meeting: 'In my personal conversation with the King, I assured him that the Catholic community had continued, during these days of mourning, in heartfelt prayer for his mother. He expressed his gratitude for this. And then, turning back to me, he asked me to ensure that the Catholics of England and Wales knew of his thanks and gratitude for these prayers.'

REMARKS TO FAITH LEADERS

My Lord Archbishop, Dean, Ladies and Gentlemen.

I am very grateful to have had this opportunity to meet you all, so soon after my Accession, in what are inevitably the saddest of circumstances for me and my Family. I have been touched by your kind words of condolence more than I can possibly say. They mean a great deal to me.

I also wanted, before all of you today, to confirm my determination to carry out my responsibilities as Sovereign of all communities around this country and the Commonwealth and in a way which reflects the world in which we now live.

I am a committed Anglican Christian, and at my Coronation I will take an oath relating to the settlement of the Church of England. At my Accession, I have already solemnly given— as has every Sovereign over the last 300 years – an Oath which pledges to maintain and preserve the Protestant faith in Scotland.

I have always thought of Britain as a 'community of communities.' That has led me to understand that the Sovereign has an additional duty – less formally recognized but to be no less diligently discharged. It is the duty to protect the diversity of our country, including by protecting the space for Faith itself and its practise through the religions, cultures, traditions and beliefs to which our hearts and minds direct us as individuals. This diversity is not just enshrined in the laws of our country, it is enjoined by my own faith. As a member of the Church of England, my Christian beliefs have love at their very heart. By my most profound convictions, therefore – as well as by my position as Sovereign – I hold myself bound to respect those who follow other spiritual paths, as well as those who seek to live their lives in accordance with secular ideals.

The beliefs that flourish in, and contribute to, our richly diverse society differ. They, and our society, can only thrive through a clear collective commitment to those vital principles of freedom of conscience, generosity of spirit and care for others which are, to me, the essence of our nationhood. I am determined, as King, to preserve and promote those principles across all communities, and for all beliefs, with all my heart.

This conviction was the foundation of everything my beloved mother did for our country, over her years as our Queen. It has been the foundation of my own work as Prince of Wales. It will continue to be the foundation of all my work as King.
