

Today's Mass: THIRD SUNDAY of the YEAR (Year A)

Isaiah 8: 23 - 9:3, Psalm 26, 1 Corinthians 1:10-13, 17, Matthew 4: 12-23

First Reading: this is the passage of scripture referred to in today's *Gospel*, in which *Matthew* emphasises that Jesus will fulfil this prophecy in His mission to the Gentiles.

The **Psalm** is a simple and confident hymn of trust in the Lord.

Second Reading: St Paul urges the Corinthians to avoid different parties within the Church and tells them to unite around Christ. This is an important text when we are observing the Octave for Christian Unity.

Gospel: Year A is the Year of Matthew, and from today onwards the Sunday *Gospels* work through the First Gospel, allowing the main themes and emphases of Matthew to emerge. In today's **Gospel** Jesus begins His public ministry. First He fulfils scripture by bringing light into darkness and begins His preaching with the message of repentance, then He calls the four fishermen to be His disciples, and finally He begins preaching and teaching, and healing.

From the Desk of the Parish Priest

The Legacy of Pope Benedict XVI: 2. Jesus of Nazareth



n August 2000, approved by the then Pope John Paul II, the Congregation for the Doctrine of the Faith published a declaration called *Dominus lesus* ('The Lord Jesus'), which asserted that Jesus Christ is the only way to salvation and that the Catholic Church is the sole true Church. The principal author is widely thought to be the then Prefect of the Congregation, one Joseph Cardinal Ratzinger.

This document, which was based on the teaching of the Second Vatican Council as well as the foundation of scripture, asserted what it called (in typical Roman or Vatican jargon) the Unicity and Universality of the salvific mystery of Jesus Christ. Quoting a phrase used by John Paul II in *Fides et Ratio*, the declaration states that "The revelation of Christ will continue to be "the true lodestar" in history for all humanity".

Having become Pope, Benedict XVI published a three volume work on the life and teachings of Jesus: Jesus of Nazareth: From the Baptism in the Jordan to the Transfiguration in 2007, Jesus of Nazareth: Holy Week (2011) and Jesus of Nazareth: The Infancy Narratives (2012). Benedict explicitly stated in the introduction that the books were not an exercise of his papal magisterium, but written purely in his personal capacity. In other words, Catholics are not obliged to agree with him.

Jesus of Nazareth is an extraordinary work, and I recommend you buy and read it. Most of us struggle to find the time to read such books; how a busy Pope found the time to write it is a marvel. Benedict had been, and remained at heart, a scholar whose mission was always to explain the Catholic faith. This work is a summary of his 60 years of theology and of his role as a pastor of souls; it is scholarly yet written so clearly that it is easily readable; it is the best introduction to

Benedict's thought and, at the same time, a most moving reflection on the significance of Jesus Christ. It is a perfect example of his ability to state profound truths simply.

Volume 1 covers the main part of Jesus' life and ministry, up to His Transfiguration, and is heavily based on the Gospel of *John*. This includes Christ's Baptism, His Temptations, the Sermon on the Mount, the Lord's Prayer, the message of the parables, the calling of the Twelve, the Confession of Peter, and the Transfiguration. In this "personal search for the face of the Lord" (see Psalm 27:8), Benedict asserts that Jesus was an historical figure, but that we have to interpret His significance theologically.

Volume II is about Holy Week, ie the period from Jesus' Entrance into Jerusalem to His Resurrection, and Benedict writes: "Only in this second volume do we encounter the decisive sayings and events of Jesus' life ... I ... hope that I have been granted an insight into the figure of our Lord that can be helpful to all readers who seek to encounter Jesus and to believe in him". The book is full of theological insights. For example the reflection on the Garden of Gethsemane examines the Passion of the Son as not simply the bodily sufferings of the Crucifixion but also as a metaphysical agony in which the Son drinks 'the chalice of wrath' prophesied by Jeremiah (Jer 25: 15-38); He who is Life itself takes on Himself the full horror of sin and evil.

In the third volume Benedict presents the stories of Jesus' infancy and childhood as being as relevant today as they were two thousand years ago. The Nativity is not merely an event in the past but one of 'unfolding significance' for people today.

In the Foreword to Volume III Benedict expresses the hope that his book "will be able to help many people on their path toward and alongside Jesus". As the publishers put it in the blurb: "there is no greater vocation for a Pope than to preach the Gospel and this is what in this book Pope Benedict has done with conviction and urgency. It is a masterpiece of its kind".

Survey responses were finely balanced between those who would like to have one large hall and those who prefer a suite of small meeting rooms

The majority of respondents (77%) attend Mass at St Thomas's at least once a <u>week</u>
