

Today's Mass: SEVENTH SUNDAY of the YEAR (Year A)

Leviticus 19: 1-2, 17-18, Psalm 102, 1 Corinthians 3: 16-23, Matthew 5: 38-48


The **First Reading** is part of what is known as the Holiness Code in Leviticus. At God's command, Moses gives some practical implications of what it means to be holy: do not bear hatred, do not exact vengeance, do not bear a grudge, in short *"you must love your neighbour as yourself"*.

The **Psalm** is a song of praise to God, who is perfectly holy, forgiving, compassionate and loving.

Second Reading: St Paul underlines the countercultural character of Christianity: Godly wisdom seems foolish to the world, and vice versa.

Gospel: Jesus continues on from last Sunday's Gospel, this week with hard sayings about nonviolent resistance and love of enemies. If this all seems a bit impossible, Jesus' last command seems totally impossible: *"you therefore must be perfect"*. If we remember that we are made in God's image, then although we know we will fail we can at least strive to be perfect like God.



Message from Mgr Boniface Tamani in Malawi

"We have had good rains this year and we cannot complain against God except ourselves. The country is being mismanaged and there is a lot of corruption going on. Consequently, there is a high rate of inflation, big rise in prices of items, and a severe shortage of food. Most people in Malawi are subsistent farmers, they eat what they grow with their own hands. They have cultivated the land for years and it is very difficult to harvest anything from one's field without applying fertilizers. Most people were not able to buy fertilizers this year for it was too expensive for them. The crops in the fields do not look good at all. The food shortage will continue throughout the year.

On 24th December, I was able to distribute some maize and maize flour to 200 families of old and vulnerable people so that they could celebrate Christmas on a full stomach. Thanks for the cash that was donated to me by parishioners when I visited you last Summer. What I got I was able to share with many who sought help for food and school fees. Every little helps, thanks to you all.

Fr Peter gave me 150 pounds for a needy family. I am pleased to report that I used this money to help three students, one is at Pius XII Seminary and two others are at Phalombe Teachers' Training College. I am pleased that in this way we were able to touch lives of many people in our limited way.

Our academic calendar is out for the final semester. Now it is clear that I can comfortably come over for supply in the months of August and September.

Pray for our country, for the economy is collapsing and there is a lot of suffering as many cannot meet their basic needs, especially food. There is a lot of dissatisfaction and anger in people's hearts.

My regards to all parishioners".

From the Desk of the Parish Priest YOUR LENTEN DISCIPLINE

ent is, as everyone knows, the time when we make a special effort to renew our Christian discipleship. This we do by almsgiving, fasting, and prayer, and by

study of our faith. So, what are YOU going to do this Lent?

Prayer

You are hardly short of opportunities to increase and deepen your prayer. How about attending an extra **Mass** each week, in addition to your Sunday attendance? Saturday morning is possible if you work during the week. Have you ever tried **Adoration before the Blessed Sacrament**? If not, give it a try: see page 2 for Adoration times.

Stations of the Cross is a very popular devotion (see page 3 for the times, or you can pray it at home via the Parish website). The **Rosary** is prayed on Saturday mornings in St Thomas's.

Go to <u>universalis.com</u> to pray the **Divine Office** (the Liturgy of the Hours) on your laptop or phone. Above all set aside time to pray at home, and in your family if you have one. Another good online source for prayer is <u>uk.magnificat.net</u>.

Fasting

This is something we in the West are not very good at (and I include myself in this!); our Moslem friends put us to shame. Ash Wednesday and Good Friday are days of fasting (that is, missing out a meal) and abstinence (that is, not partaking of meat; if you are vegetarian or vegan, abstain from something else). And all Fridays are days of abstinence. If you are not in the habit of abstaining on Fridays, Lent is the ideal time to start.

The Friday before the CAFOD Second Collection is an opportunity to fast and to donate the money you would have spent on food and drink to CAFOD.

Fasting from **overuse of phones and social media** will help you to avoid become enslaved to technology (younger people please note!). Fasting from being over hasty in getting your opinion across would also be a good Lenten discipline.

Almsgiving

There is no lack of suitable recipients of your almsgiving. We have our Second Collections for the Mission Appeal, the Sick & Retired Priests' Fund, CAFOD, etc, and the DEC is collecting for the earthquake victims in Turkey and Syria. Donations to the **Foodbanks** in Sevenoaks, Borough Green and West Kingsdown also come under this heading. And there are many charities you can support, including Aid to the Church in Need and Life organisations.

Study

You are spoilt in this Parish for opportunities to deepen your knowledge and understanding of the faith.

On Tuesdays, starting on 28th February in the Parish Centre, we are resuming the very popular **Sycamore programme**, which was cut short by the pandemic. It starts with a light meal, followed by easy to follow video presentations and small group discussions. The theme of the videos is *Living the Christian Faith in the World*.

On Thursdays, also in the Parish Centre with refreshments from 7:00pm, we have a series of more in depth **talks** on the theme '*Remember that you are dust, and to dust you shall return'*. These start on Thursday 2nd March. See the back page for full details.

Do not be deterred by thinking these sessions will be over your head; on the contrary you will gain much understanding and deepen your closeness to Christ.

Penance

It would be remiss of me not to remind you of the need to go to **Confession** in Lent. The Saturday times are listed on page 2. You can always approach a Priest for Confession before (if there is time) or after a Mass. You can find Confession times in neighbouring Parishes from their websites.

Lenten discipline and exercises

The above suggestions are not either/or. You can adopt more than one Lenten discipline. The important thing is to decide what you are going to do this Lent and ask the Holy Spirit to help you stick to it. If your Lenten discipline in previous years seems a bit stale, choose something new.

Look on Lent as a time for spiritual exercises, to help us love God and our neighbours better. If you want to learn the piano, say, you must do your regular exercises. It is the same with our spiritual lives, and Lent is the time to get into the habit of doing spiritual exercises, especially self-denial and prayer.

Lent is upon us, a marvellous time for spiritual growth, if only we would seize the opportunity. What is stopping you?

SOCIETY OF AFRICAN MISSIONS



Society of African Missions (SMA) International

The Missionary Society

We are an international missionary Society with members coming from 24 countries. Our missionary focus is Africa and her people. Our purpose is to spread the Gospel. Our missionaries presently serve in 17 different African countries.

The Society was founded at Lyons, France in 1856 by a French Missionary Bishop, Bishop Melchior de Marion Bresiallac. He set out the following four guiding principles for his work at the beginning of his missionary career:

"To be a missionary with all my heart

To neglect nothing that will advance the work of God

To seize every opportunity of preaching the word of God

To use every available means to train a native clergy".

The British Province of the Society had its beginnings in Manchester in 1953, where today, we have a mission promotions centre. A further two mission promotions centres are located in Northwood, near Watford and Dunblane in Scotland. The Provincial Superior resides in Manchester The Society is sometimes known as the SMA Fathers. People often ask, then why SMA and not SAM? The initials refer to the name in Latin: Societas Missionum ad Afros which translates to Society of African Missions.

Our Mission

The Society of African Missions (SMA) is committed to preaching the Good News of Jesus Christ chiefly in Africa and to people of African origin. We regard solidarity with the poor and the powerless, commitment to reading the signs of the times, activities for Justice and Peace, dedication to building a better world, including care for the environment, as constitutive dimensions of witnessing to the Good News. We do this through education, health care, development projects and conscientisation for justice. We also help in caring for African immigrants in Europe and the USA and draw attention to those structures that oppress them and other people of the Third World.

Though the obstacles are many, the Society of African Missions is filled with hope, a hope that is rooted in the Gospel of Jesus Christ. In the service of this Gospel, whose power we have witnessed in the birth of new Christian communities throughout Africa, we seek to give prophetic witness to the

- Word that is Truth,
- Word that illumines and gives life,
- Word that liberates and transforms.

The Apostolate of the Society of African Missions is of its nature specifically missionary. We are not "extra clergy" but missionaries engaged in the Church's Mission 'ad Gentes' (to the Gentiles). Called "to bear witness to the Risen Christ among the nations" (Redemptoris Missio, no 66), we reach out, not only across geographical barriers, but across social and cultural barriers, to those who are most abandoned and marginalised, to the victims of war and violence, to refugees in Africa and outside it, to women and children, and to all those who await the Gospel of hope.

SMA Missionaries live and work in solidarity with our African brothers and sisters struggling for justice and peace in the midst of political turmoil and social disintegration: members are prepared to dedicate ourselves with courage to stand by the people in the many troubled regions on the continent of Africa.
