# Today's Mass: SECOND SUNDAY of EASTER (or of Divine Mercy)

Acts of the Apostles 2: 42-47, Psalm 117, 1 Peter 1: 3-9, John 20: 19-31

First Reading: this tells of the characteristics of the early Church, which was "faithful to the teaching of the apostles", to "the breaking of bread" (that is, the Eucharist) and to prayer. Notice how attractive this was to others. Is our parish and our worship likewise appealing and enticing?


**Responsorial Psalm**: we sing our thanksgiving in more verses from Easter Sunday's psalm.

Second Reading: on most of the Easter Sundays in Year A extracts from 1 Peter are read. Some scholars think that this letter is based on an Easter homily of St Peter. As sharers in the life of the risen Christ the Baptized are to worship God with joy and to proclaim the good news of Christ.

Gospel: John records the first appearance of the risen Jesus to the disciples – through closed doors on Easter Sunday itself - and then His second appearance "eight days later" (which, in the way the ancients counted, means a week later, that is today) to them, who this time include Thomas. Doubting Thomas he may have been, but now Thomas is an example of faith and belief in Christ.

The greeting "Peace be with you" used by the risen Christ is the greeting said by Bishops at the beginning of Mass.



# MESSAGE FROM FR VIPIN

#### Hello everyone!!!

I am Fr Vipin James and was born in Kerala in India on 22<sup>nd</sup> October 1986. My parents are Mr James and Mrs Rani and I have got two elder siblings, Jins and Jibin. They both are married and have one nephew at home.

After my school, I was joined in a religious seminary called SDV (Society of Divine Vocation) at the age of fifteen in 2002. After the twelve years of priestly formation in the seminary I was ordained to the priesthood on 23<sup>rd</sup> April 2014 by Archbishop Mar Joseph Pawathil in native parish Kainday.

My first appointment was as Assistant Priest at Parampuzha parish in the diocese of Chaganachery, which is in my own diocese in Kerala. After the two years at the parish, I have been asked by my superiors to come to England in 2017. I was Assistant Priest in Stechford parish (Birmingham) and Heston parish (Westminster) community for one year each. In 2020, I was appointed as Priest in Charge in Hawarden parish in Wrexham diocese, Wales, for two years. Finally, I am appointed as Assistant Priest in Sevenoaks for my future priestly ministry under Southwark Archdiocese.

My hobbies are cricket, badminton and park running.

# From the Desk of the Parish Priest

# What is the Easter Precept?

There are five Precepts of the Church (see the *Catechism of the Catholic Church* 2041 – 2043):

- 1. You shall attend Mass on Sundays and Holydays of Obligation,
- You shall confess your sins at least once a year,
- You shall humbly receive your Creator in Holy Communion at least during the Easter season,
- 4. You shall keep holy the Holy Days of Obligation,
- 5. You shall observe the prescribed days of fasting and abstinence.

Let us look more closely at the second and third, the 'Easter Precept'. These are often referred to as one's Easter Duty. Just to confuse us, the Bishops of England & Wales ruled some time ago that the Easter period during which one can fulfil the Easter Precept stretches from Ash Wednesday to Trinity Sunday.

Actually, the requirement for at least an annual Confession does not have to be done at Eastertide. Canon 989 simply states that everyone who has reached the age of discretion is required to confess his/ her grave sins at least once a year. Canon 988 recommends – but does not oblige – a Catholic to confess his/her venial sins.

So, if someone is not aware of having committed any serious sins, they are not required to go to Confession. However, as we all commit venial sins, a yearly Confession is recommended. Pope St John Paul II used to confess daily, and it is difficult to imagine he had the opportunity to commit grave sins each day!

Church law here is stating the absolute minimum that is acceptable for a practising Catholic; doing the bare minimum is, one might say, hardly an adequate response to Christ's frequent command to repent of our sins. Canon 920 states that once a Catholic has received Holy Communion for the first time, he/she should receive Holy Communion at least once a year, and this should be at Eastertide.

But there may be people who are unable to receive Holy Communion. Canon 916 says that anyone who is conscious of mortal sin may not receive the Eucharist without first having gone to Confession. Canon 915 says that people who have been excommunicated or who are under a penalty may not be admitted to Holy Communion.

To summarise: there are five conditions for being able to receive Holy Communion. *First*, one must be in a state of grace; this is based on the teaching of St Paul (*1 Corinthians* 11: 27-28). If one has committed a mortal sin, one should not receive the Eucharist as this profanes the Blessed Sacrament most grievously. Scripture identifies mortal sin, if you are unsure: see *1 Corinthians* 6: 9-10 and *Galatians* 5: 19-21.

Secondly, one must have been to Confession since one's last mortal sin, as I have already said. *Thirdly*, one must believe in the real presence of Christ in the Eucharist; this is often referred to by its technical name of Transubstantiation. This is based on *1 Corinthians* 11: 29. *Fourthly*, one must have observed the Eucharistic fast of one hour before reception. And *fifthly* one must not be under an ecclesiastical censure.

It is the nature of Church (and all) law to put things negatively. 'You shall not murder' is a legal, if negative, way of affirming the right to life. Likewise, these Church Canons state what is not permitted, but their purpose is to assist Catholics positively to avail themselves of the means to receive the good graces Christ has bequeathed to His Church. Being absolved of your sins is a necessary means of becoming perfect in order to enter heaven. Receiving Holy Communion affords an intimate encounter with Jesus Christ, deepening our unity with Christ's Church and assimilating us more fully into Christ.

# 2022 PARISH FINANCIAL OVERVIEW

The Financial statements on the back page show a summary of the Parish Accounts for the year to December 2022 with a comparison to 2021 and 2020. The Finance Committee of the Parish are keen to be transparent as possible as we take the stewardship of our financial resources seriously. Please do review this carefully. Unlike most other parishes in our Archdiocese, who are having a very hard time financially, we are in a good situation because of all your support. One of the unique aspects of our Parish is that, unlike other Parishes, we have four Mass centres - in Sevenoaks, Otford, West Kingsdown and Borough Green; and all these properties and the Presbytery need to be maintained and comply with Health and Safety regulations.

During the year ending December 2022 the Parish made an operating profit of £13,353 before major works costs (capital projects) and depreciation, compared to an operating profit of £12,199 in 2021. Please note we use cash accounting and not accrual accounting in the financial statements.

#### **Operating Income**

Operating Income was £210,162 in 2022 compared to £202,434 in 2021. The Offertory was £144,736 in 2022 compared to £132,430 in 2021 - £12,306 higher. Parishioners are switching to regular donation by bank Standing Order, with Gift Aid, which assures the Church of a more assured steady income. We are keen to maximise the Gift Aid on income. If you have not switched to Standing Order please do this with Gift Aid.

#### **Operating Expenditure**

Operating Expenditure was £196,809 in 2022 compared to £190,236 in 2021. Major items of expenditure are cost of supply Priests to say Mass at our various Mass centres, grounds maintenance, boiler servicing and Church supplies. These all reflect the full opening of the churches after COVID. Repository expenditure was higher in 2022 but this was matched by a higher income. Office costs reverted to a normal level after the previous years' expenditure on a new photocopier. Staff costs were slightly higher in 2022 after the Diocese gave all employed staff a cost of living pay increase of 5% and a one off fuel contribution of £750 pro rata. Other areas of expenditure remain more or less in line with 2021 and were within budget.

During 2022 the major works costs were the building of the new garage in Sevenoaks and the resurfacing of the Otford car park.

#### Summary

The Parish continues to break even at the operating level but is required to use saved cash assets for any major capital projects. The Parish has around £430k of liquid net assets. The Parish would aim to keep £250k as a reserve which means it has around £180k for projects. During 2023 the Parish needs to spend £13k on church lighting, £5k on electrical repairs and £5k on Presbytery refurbishment which leaves around £157k for other projects.

We thank you, the Parish community, for your continued generosity to our Parish, in keeping our ability to continue to celebrate our faith together and support the Archdiocese of Southwark, during this most difficult of years.
