# Today's Mass: THIRD SUNDAY of EASTER

 $Acts \ of \ the \ Apostles \ 2: \ 14, \ 22 - 33, \ Psalm \ 15, \ 1 \ Peter \ 1: \ 17 - 21, \ Luke \ 24: \ 13 - 35$ 


**First Reading**: the readings from *Acts of the Apostles* continue throughout the 50 days of Eastertide. The early Church we hear about in these readings is the first fruit of Christ's resurrection and the gift of the Holy Spirit at Pentecost, on the day of which St Peter preaches the homily recorded in today's reading.

**Psalm**: this is the Psalm to which St Peter refers in the middle of his homily in the *First Reading*.

**Second Reading:** St Peter says that newly Baptized Christians must live in the world as strangers or transients, now that Jesus – by the shedding of his blood on the cross – has paid the ransom to free them from their previous state of sin.

**Gospel**: although we are in Year A (the Year of *Matthew*), today's *Gospel* is from *Luke*, and is the famous and touching account of two disciples on the road to Emmaus, who only recognised Him at the breaking of bread. This is one of the many passages in the Scriptures from which the Church's understanding of the Eucharist is derived, and notice especially that Jesus performed the same four fold action as at the Last Supper and at the Feeding of the 5,000. As early as the *Acts of the Apostles* was written, the 'Breaking of Bread' was a technical term for the Eucharist; it doesn't just refer to having an ordinary meal.



## St George (Monday)

George, sometimes called George of Lydda, was, according to tradition, a Christian soldier in the Roman army, a member of the Emperor's Praetorian Guard. He was

sentenced to death for refusing to renounce his Christian beliefs and died – a martyr – in the Diocletian persecution of 303.

The legend that he killed a dragon – who was killing villagers – and rescued a princess who was to be the dragon's next victim only dates from the 11<sup>th</sup> century. Clearly it is only a legend, but one which became very popular at the time of the crusades as one of the military saints.

This popularity led to George becoming the patron saint of England in the 14<sup>th</sup> century, and his cross (the red cross on a white background) is the flag of England and part of the Union Flag of the UK. He is also a patron saint of Ethiopia, Georgia (the country), Malta and Gozo, Aragon, Valencia, the Balearic Islands and Catalonia in Spain, and Portugal. In addition he is the patron saint of the scouts, soldiers (especially cavalry), and, somewhat puzzlingly, of skin disease sufferers.

His feast day is actually 23<sup>rd</sup> April, but as our national patron his feast ranks as a Solemnity and so is transferred this year from the Sunday to Monday.

# St Mark

#### (Tuesday)

Mark (also known as John Mark) is considered to be the author of the Gospel of Mark and so is one of the Evangelists. The most common theory is that he got his information for Gospel directly the from St Peter



# Saints this Week

According to *Acts* 15:39 he accompanied Barnabas to Cyprus after the Council of Jerusalem.

According to tradition he founded the episcopal see of Alexandria, in northern Egypt, and his symbol is the winged lion; this is how he is often depicted in art.

The Gospel was written in Greek for a gentile readership, and probably written in Rome. Most scholars think *Mark* was the earliest Gospel, but not everyone agrees with this. It is certainly the briefest, but mysteriously ends halfway through a sentence.

He is the patron of notaries, of several cities in Italy, especially Venice, of lions, insect bites, struma (a swelling of the thyroid gland in the neck, apparently), and against impenitence.

## St Catherine of Siena

# (Saturday)

We are on much surer historical ground with St Catherine of Siena, Virgin, Doctor of the Church, and a Patron of Europe. She lived from 1347 to 1380 and was a member of the Third Order of St Dominic. She was a mystic, activist, and an author, and was very



significant in Church history: she persuaded Pope Gregory XI to leave Avignon for Rome in 1376. It was very exceptional at that time for a woman to have had such importance in politics and in history.

Her many patronages include people ridiculed for their piety, nurses, and sick people. In 1999 Pope St John Paul II made her a patron of Europe. She is not to be confused with St Catherine of Alexandria (of Catherine wheel fame) or any of the other saints of the same name.

Her writings, including a treatise called *The Dialogue of Divine Providence*, letters and prayers, describe her mystical or ecstatic visions, and attempts to achieve union with God. She practised extreme asceticism, to the extent in her later life of living solely on the Eucharist. She described God as the *"sea, in which we are the fish"*.

# WOMEN'S RETREAT AT AYLESFORD

It was so good to be able to go again to Aylesford Priory for a weekend Retreat. We were blessed with blue skies and sunshine, which meant tranquil walks in the grounds, contemplating the enlightening sessions of our inspiring facilitator Sister Aileen Murphy from Dublin, a sister of the order of La Retraite.

The theme was the "Wilderness -Amazing space, amazing grace" and we had six sessions, starting with Beloved is where we begin - Christ's Baptism. Then sessions on listening deeply, fullness of life in the emptiest of places, hidden treasures, testing times and untangling the threads that bind.

Sister Aileen knew well how to lead in a gentle, quiet, sensitive way, allowing everyone to contribute their thoughts in their own time. Splitting into small groups allowed more sharing of ideas on the meaning for us of the six tenets of the Lord's Prayer: faith, surrender, service, abundance, forgiveness & strength.

Saturday & Sunday Masses were joyful with a packed Chapel & Fr Michael anxious to leave no-one standing. In addition to all the local people, there was our Retreat group & the Retreat for the LGBTQ group.

It was a weekend of rich spiritual food, but also most enjoyable full breakfasts, lunch and evening meals in the historic Pilgrims' Hall and a social get-together on Saturday evening.

Such Retreats which grew out of the Parish Mission are to be highly recommended and thanks go to Catherine Rodger for organising them.
