



Today's Mass: FIFTH SUNDAY of EASTER

Acts of the Apostles 6: 1-7, Psalm 32, 1 Peter 2: 4-9, John 14: 1-12

First Reading: the early Church was increasing so rapidly that some officials had to be appointed to oversee the distribution to the needy, and to avoid disunity among the followers. Here we see the origins of the Order of Deacons: the apostles selected the seven men, laid hands on them, and commissioned them for service ('diakonia' in Greek). Deacons have an important liturgical role in Mass and an important ministry to those in need.

Psalm: this hymn of praise has one enigmatic feature: the full psalm has the same number of verses as letters in the Hebrew alphabet.

Second Reading: St Peter thinks of the Church as a building, not literally but metaphorically as the people of God. And in a well-known phrase he describes the people of God in language previously applied to Israel. It is in Baptism that we become "a chosen race, a royal priesthood, a consecrated nation, a people apart ...", in short the People of God.

Gospel: in this extract from His discourse at the Last Supper, as told by *John*, Jesus announces that He will be going away, to the Father. But we can follow Him, because He "is the Way, the *Truth and the Life*". At the end of the *Gospel* He refers to the Church, which will continue the mission of the risen Christ after His return to the Father.



There are 5 - 6 Ukrainians, consisting of a mum and two children, a teenage girl and grandmother, and possibly another adult lady. They have jobs in the area; the families can be housed all together or separately. Hosts typically receive £500 per month from the Council for this. Other options are possible if sufficient charitable donations are received.

From the Desk of the Parish Priest

Holy Communion under both kinds

uring the COVID pandemic, the use of the Chalice to administer the Precious Blood was suspended. The Bishops of England & Wales decided that the reception of Holy Communion under both kinds could resume from Maundy Thursday, at the evening Mass of the Lord's Supper.

We believe that the Eucharist is the source and summit of the Church's life (*Catechism of the Catholic Church* 1324), and when we gather in church on a Sunday or weekday, our participation in the sacrificial meal binds us once more to Christ and each other. Indeed, it is when we gather on a Sunday in church that the celebration of the Mass makes us into the People of God in that place.

At each Mass we trust in the word Jesus spoke to the crowd after the multiplication of the loaves: "whoever feeds on my flesh and drinks my blood has eternal life, and I will raise him up on the last day. For my flesh is real food, and my blood is real drink" (John 6: 54-55).

Why receive from the Chalice?

The Church teaches that the Body, Blood, Soul and Divinity of Christ is present in both the Sacred Host and the Precious Blood, and so there is no obligation to receive Holy Communion from the Chalice; in receiving either or both we always receive the 'whole' Jesus.

Nevertheless, where practicable the Church offers us Holy Communion under both kinds to help awaken in us a deeper understanding of what we are doing. By eating and drinking we come closer to the Apostles at the Last Supper and to Mary and the beloved disciple on Calvary witnessing Christ's broken body and outpoured blood on the Cross.

This explains the teaching contained in the Roman Missal, which talks of Communion having "a fuller sign when it takes place under both kinds, for in this form the sign of the Eucharistic banquet is more clearly evident and clearer expression is given to the divine will by which the new and eternal Covenant is ratified in the Blood of the Lord". Both at the Last Supper and at Mass, we hear the words of Jesus: "Take and eat … take and drink".

How to receive?

Always with reverence and faith. We should participate fully in the prayers of the Mass, and at the same time develop a personal hunger and thirst for Jesus in our hearts. We imagine ourselves gathered

with the Apostles at the Last Supper, and have a profound sense of God's love and grace being lavished upon us.

We process forward in the Communion Procession; when the minister says 'The Body of Christ' say 'Amen' clearly, as this is your assent to the Real Presence of Christ at that most solemn moment. We receive either on the tongue or - as is permitted in England & Wales - in the hand; consume the Host immediately.

If receiving the Precious Blood, again say 'Amen', take the chalice, consume a drop, and return it to the minister. It is for parents to decide how their children should receive the Host, and if they receive the Precious Blood.

After receiving, return to your place for silent prayer, above all a prayer of thanksgiving. Note that our utmost respect for Holy Communion means we should refer to it correctly: we receive the Body of Christ and the Blood of Christ; we <u>never</u> speak of 'eating the bread' or 'drinking the wine'.

Health Issues

Medical advice is that the danger of infection is minimal when the Chalice is made of precious metal, wine with a high alcohol content is used, and proper purification of the vessels takes place. However, anyone suffering from COVID or a similar illness such as flu or a cold may wish to refrain from receiving from the Chalice. Equally, if you are worried about receiving from the Chalice, then you can choose not to.



EXTRACTS FROM LUMEN GENTIUM

9. At all times and in every race God has given welcome to whosoever fears Him and does what is right. God, however, does not make men holy and save them merely as individuals, without bond or link between one another. Rather has it pleased Him to bring men together as one people, a people which acknowledges Him in truth and serves Him in holiness. He therefore chose the race of Israel as a people unto Himself. With it He set up a covenant. Step by step He taught and prepared this people, making known in its history both Himself and the decree of His will and making it holy unto Himself. All these things, however, were done by way of preparation and as a figure of that new and perfect covenant, which was to be ratified in Christ, and of that fuller revelation which was to be given through the Word of God Himself made flesh. "Behold the days shall come saith the Lord, and I will make a new covenant with the House of Israel, and with the house of Judah . . . I will give my law in their bowels, and I will write it in their heart, and I will be their God, and they shall be my people . . . For all of them shall know Me, from the least of them even to the greatest, saith the Lord. Christ instituted this new covenant, the new testament, that is to say, in His Blood, calling together a people made up of Jew and gentile, making them one, not according to the flesh but in the Spirit. This was to be the new People of God. For those who believe in Christ, who are reborn not from a perishable but from an imperishable seed through the word of the living God, not from the flesh but from water and the Holy Spirit, are finally established as "a chosen race, a royal priesthood, a holy nation, a purchased people . . . who in times past were not a people, but are now the people of God".

10. Christ the Lord, High Priest taken from among men, made the new people "a kingdom and priests to God the Father". The baptized, by regeneration and the anointing of the Holy Spirit, are consecrated as a spiritual house and a holy priesthood, in order that through all those works which are those of the Christian man they may offer spiritual sacrifices and proclaim the power of Him who has called them out of darkness into His marvellous light. Therefore all the disciples of Christ, persevering in prayer and praising God, should present themselves as a living sacrifice, holy and pleasing to God. Everywhere on earth they must bear witness to Christ and give an answer to those who seek an account of that hope of eternal life which is in them.

Though they differ from one another in essence and not only in degree, the common priesthood of the faithful and the ministerial or hierarchical priesthood are nonetheless interrelated: each of them in its own special way is a participation in the one priesthood of Christ. The ministerial priest, by the sacred power he enjoys, teaches and rules the priestly people; acting in the person of Christ, he makes present the Eucharistic sacrifice, and offers it to God in the name of all the people. But the faithful, in virtue of their royal priesthood, join in the offering of the Eucharist. They likewise exercise that priesthood in receiving the sacraments, in prayer and thanksgiving, in the witness of a holy life, and by self-denial and active charity.

- 12. The holy people of God shares also in Christ's prophetic office; it spreads abroad a living witness to Him, especially by means of a life of faith and charity and by offering to God a sacrifice of praise, the tribute of lips which give praise to His name.
- 13. All men are called to belong to the new people of God. Wherefore this people, while remaining one and only one, is to be spread throughout the whole world and must exist in all ages, so that the decree of God's will may be fulfilled.
