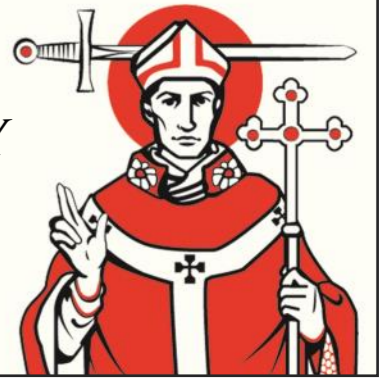

Today's Mass: SIXTH SUNDAY of EASTER

Acts of the Apostles 8: 5-8, 14-17, *Psalms* 65, *1 Peter* 3: 15-18, *John* 14: 15-21

First Reading: Philip makes many converts among the Samaritans. Here we see the beginnings of the mission of the Church – under the guidance of the Holy Spirit - beyond the Jews themselves (for the Jews regarded the Samaritans as racially impure Jews).

Psalm: this psalm of praise recalls the exodus, through the waters of the Red Sea.

Second Reading: St Peter urges us to know our faith well enough to be able to give others reasons for our hope. If we have to suffer in this, our model – and our help – is Christ.

Gospel: Jesus underlines that to keep His commandments is to remain in His love. He also says that (after His Ascension) He will send the 'Paraclete', which can mean an advocate (as in a court of law) or a consoler. The Holy Spirit, which will replace Jesus, is probably both.

New National Shrine

The Archbishop is delighted to announce that the Diocesan Shrine of St Oscar Romero at St George's Cathedral, Southwark, has been elevated to the status of a National Shrine for England & Wales, following a recent unanimous decision by the Bishops' Conference. Commenting on this elevation, the Archbishop said: *"We are very grateful to the Bishops of England and Wales for their support in enabling our Diocesan Shrine to now become a National Shrine for the benefit of people across our Dioceses. St Oscar Romero calls us to faithful discipleship of the Lord Jesus and to the full*

proclamation of the Gospel. We are a people of the Beatitudes who must announce and live the Beatitudes. When Christ taught us to love and to serve he really did mean us to put this into practice, especially towards those in most need. Love of Christ and love of neighbour mean that defending human life and dignity, and working for justice and peace, are integral to our witness. In this, we look to St Oscar's inspiring example and ask his heavenly intercession."

St Oscar Romero was Archbishop of San Salvador in El Salvador from 1977 until his assassination and martyrdom on 24th March 1980. He was an outspoken advocate of the Gospel and the teaching of the Catholic Church, in defence of peace and justice, human rights, and the protection of the poor. He was canonised by Pope Francis in 2018. The centrepiece of the Shrine in the Cathedral is a three dimensional Romero Cross, designed by the renowned Salvadoran artist, Fernando Ilort, and it contains a reliquary which contains a fragment of the blood-stained alb Romero was wearing as he celebrated Mass when he was killed.

Accommodation needed for Ukrainian families. Can you help?

Mothers Prayers, a local organisation closely associated with our parish, has been generously providing accommodation for Ukrainian refugees in Star House, near Dunton Green, for over a year. We are grateful to Veronica Williams, the founder, and the Trustees for their generosity. These Ukrainian guests now need to leave Star House by the end of July and are seeking accommodation locally.

There are 5 - 6 Ukrainians, consisting of a mum and two children, a teenage girl and grandmother, and possibly another adult lady. They have jobs in the area; the families can be housed all together or separately. Hosts typically receive £500 per month from the Council for this. Other options are possible if sufficient charitable donations are received.

From the Desk of the Parish Priest

The last Catholic Coronation

The latest in a series of answers to parishioners' questions. This time: 'when was the last Catholic Coronation in England?'

The Catholic elements in the Coronation

The Coronation of King Charles III and Queen Camilla on 6th May in Westminster Abbey, although an Anglican Liturgy, contained many Catholic elements, surviving from the pre-Reformation days when England was a Catholic country. These elements include the King's silent prayer and expression of allegiance first to Almighty God, the priestly robes placed on the King, his anointing with oil (a gesture very familiar to Catholics), and the fact that the ceremony was in the context of a Eucharist (with the new King and Queen receiving Holy Communion).

For the first time in over 400 years Catholic prelates were present, including the Papal Nuncio, the Archbishops of Cardiff and of Armagh, and the Bishop of Aberdeen. Vincent Cardinal Nichols, Archbishop of Westminster, was not only present but offered a Blessing alongside other Christian leaders.

Seventy years ago it was not permitted for a Catholic to enter a Protestant Church, let alone participate in an Anglican Coronation service, so there were no Catholic representatives at Elizabeth II's Coronation in 1953.

On the other side of the coin, the King was required by the Coronation Oath Act of 1688 to declare during the ceremony that he is a faithful Protestant and that he will maintain 'the Protestant Reformed Religion established by law'. This goes back to the accession of William and Mary, who displaced James II.

The last Catholic monarchs

The last Catholic Monarch was James Stuart, James II of England and of Ireland and James VII of Scotland, who reigned from 1685 to 1688. He was a convert to Catholicism, but his (prompt) Coronation in Westminster Abbey would have been an Anglican one. His father, Charles II, converted to Catholicism, but only on his death bed, so his Coronation would also have been an Anglican one.

The last monarch to be crowned in a Catholic ceremony was Elizabeth I, in 1559. Her predecessor, Mary, had returned England to the Catholic faith, and so the Coronation was a Catholic one. It was, however, fraught with religious tensions. Elizabeth herself favoured the Protestant cause, and subsequently returned England to Protestantism in what is known as the Elizabethan Settlement.

The main problem was the officiating bishop. The (Catholic) Archbishop of Canterbury - Cardinal Pole (pronounced Pool) - died 12 hours after Queen Mary, and there was as yet no successor. The Archbishop of York declined to do it, and the Bishop of London was unacceptable to Elizabeth because he had persecuted Protestants. The Bishop of Winchester was under house arrest for an anti-Protestant sermon, and the Bishop of Chichester had also just died. Finally the very low ranking Bishop of Carlisle was coerced into performing the crowning.

The Order of Service was the *Liber Regalis*, first used in the Coronation of Edward II in 1308, and was the last Coronation to include Catholic Mass. It is unclear if Elizabeth received Communion, but the various elements of the ceremony were as in previous Coronations, and were the last in Latin.

Somewhat ironically, the last King to be crowned as a Catholic was Henry VIII. His Coronation on 23rd June 1509 in Westminster Abbey was a very grand affair and was followed by a very grand banquet in Westminster Hall. Catherine of Aragon was crowned Queen as well. This was (again somewhat ironically) the last full joint Coronation until that of James II and Mary of Modena in 1685, nearly two centuries later.

Other Catholic monarchs

There are Catholic monarchs, including the Kings of Spain and of Belgium, the Princes of Monaco and of Liechtenstein, the Grand Duke of Luxembourg, and (at least in theory) the Pope in Vatican City, but none of them has a Coronation as in the United Kingdom. We are the only European country which still crowns Kings and Queens in this elaborate ceremonial, which is over a millennium old.

NOVENA TO THE HOLY SPIRIT FOR THE REUNION OF CHRISTENDOM

What is a Novena?

A Novena is a nine day period of private or public prayer to obtain some special grace or make particular petitions. Novena comes from the Latin *novem*, meaning nine. It differs from an Octave, which is a week of celebration which follows an important feast like Easter.

The origin of the Novena does not come from the Old Testament but from the New. We are told in Acts 1: 12-14 that the apostles and the women, including Mary the Mother of Christ, prayed during the nine days between the Ascension and Pentecost, as they awaited the coming of the Holy Spirit.

The ancient Romans also had the practice of having nine days of prayers for various reasons, and the early Church may have taken over this practice.

There have over the history of the Church been Novenas for all sorts of things: these have included a Novena of Masses for the repose of a soul when someone died, Novenas (especially in Spain and France) in the nine days before Christmas – signifying the nine months Our Lord spent in the womb of his mother – and the Novena of the Sacred Heart, still widely celebrated in places dedicated to the Sacred Heart.

But the original Novena – that is the first of all Novenas – is the one between the Ascension and Pentecost, and is kept by the Church each year as prayers for the reunion of Christendom.

The Novena to the Holy Spirit for the Reunion of Christendom

The chief object of this Novena is to pray that Christians may be reunited from their present disunity. Whether your view is that the purpose is to recall those who have fallen away from the true Church by their heresy or schism, or at the other end of the spectrum that its purpose is to recognise that Christians are already almost united in practice, or whether your view is somewhere in between, no one can deny that this prayer for unity is vital and important.

Pope Leo XIII emphasised the need for the Holy Spirit to intervene in this area of the life of the Church in his Apostolic Letter *Provida Matris Caritate* in 1895 and decreed the observance of the Novena in his Encyclical *Divinum Illud Munus* in 1897.

Pope St John Paul II also keenly stressed the need for this Novena for Christian unity. Before the Angelus one Sunday he said: *"In promising His peace, Christ assured the disciples of His support in trials. And is not the lasting division between Christians a very painful trial? This is why they feel the great need to turn to their One and Only Lord, asking that He help them overcome the temptation of discouragement along the difficult path which leads to full communion. In a world thirsting for peace, it is in fact urgent for Christian communities to announce the Gospel in a unified way. It is indispensable that they witness to the divine Love that unites them, that they be bearers of joy, hope and peace, becoming leaven for all of mankind."*

The *Enchiridion of Indulgences* (§34) notes that *"a partial indulgence is granted to the faithful, who devoutly take part in the pious exercise of a public novena before the feast of Christmas or Pentecost or the Immaculate Conception of the Blessed Virgin Mary"*. In this way the Church emphasises that the Novena is a pious spiritual exercise, and is to be commended, always remembering that God the Father answers all our prayers according to his divine will.
