

#### Today's Mass: PENTECOST

Fifty days after the Resurrection, we celebrate the promised descent of the Holy Spirit on the day of the Jewish Feast of Pentecost. This day is often called Whitsun ('White Sunday') in England, because it was the last day the adults Baptized at Easter wore their white Baptismal garments.

At the **Vigil Mass** on Saturday evening we wait in vigil for the descent of the Holy Spirit, which will happen liturgically on Sunday. There are up to four **Old Testament readings**. The first, from Genesis, is significant: it tells of the confusing variety of languages resulting from the attempt to build the tower of Babel. Pentecost undoes this. The coming of the Spirit is promised in the **Gospel**.

At Mass during the day, the First Reading is the famous account in Acts of the tongues of fire coming upon the apostles on the day of Pentecost. This marks the beginning of the Church's proclamation of the gospel of Jesus Christ.

The **Psalm** is a poem of creation, recalling the role of the Spirit at creation and calling on the Spirit to 'renew the face of the earth'.


**Second Reading:** the Spirit is given to every Baptized person, but different people have different gifts.

The obligatory Sequence is a beautiful poem composed by Stephen Langton, Archbishop of Canterbury, who died in 1228. It should be sung (see the hymn book for tunes).

**Gospel**: Christ Himself confers the Holy Spirit on the disciples. The greeting of the risen Jesus - "Peace be with you" - is that used by a Bishop at the beginning of Mass.

In summary, the Holy Spirit is present in the universe (*Psalm*), in the Bishops, successors of the apostles (First Reading and Gospel), in every Baptized member of the Church (Second Reading and Sequence), and is active in the preaching of the Church (First Reading and Gospel).

#### TODAY

#### Pentecost

Pentecost is the third most important date in the Church's year. It ends the season of Easter, and afterwards the Paschal Candle is relocated from the Ambo to the Baptistery. The Sequence is sung or said after the Second Reading; please stand for it. The double Alleluia is sung or said after the Dismissal. The liturgical colour is red, symbolising the joy and fire of the Holy Spirit.

Today is a Day of Prayer for the Church. Today is also, as it happens, the date of the elevation of the diocese of Southwark to a Metropolitan Archdiocese and the erection of the diocese of Arundel & Brighton, in 1965.

#### Pentecost Vigil

Please note that the Saturday evening Mass is the Pentecost Vigil, which is different from the Mass of the Day. There are extra readings, and the readings are not those of the Mass of the Day, and so not those in the middle of this Newsletter. The Mass does, however, fulfil your obligation to attend Sunday Mass.

#### From the Desk of the Parish Priest

s I said in my Saturday email to registered parishioners, if you were surprised to learn that I will be moving parish in September, imagine how surprised I was when I was asked to move. I had imagined that I would be Parish Priest of Sevenoaks until I retired, like my two predecessors, or until I died in office, like their two predecessors. But the Holy Spirit, or perhaps I should say, the Archbishop, obviously had other ideas.

#### **Promise of Obedience**

When a priest is Ordained, he makes a Promise of Obedience. He kneels before the ordaining Bishop – in my case Archbishop Michael Bowen in St George's Cathedral on 11<sup>th</sup> May 1996 – and places his joined hands between the Bishop's hands. The Bishop (if he is the Ordinary, that is the diocesan Bishop) asks 'Do you promise respect and obedience to me and my successors?' He replies 'I do'.

This has certain implications, one of which is that essentially a priest goes where his superior, in my case the Archbishop of Southwark, sends him. There are some limitations on this. The Bishop can only move a priest within his own diocese, he can't tell him to go elsewhere. Under Canon Law a Parish Priest can only be moved if the Bishop has a suitable post to which to move him. If I had a good reason for not making the move (for example if I were about to have major surgery) I could dissuade the Bishop from making the appointment, but it would have to be a genuine reason not to move.

On the other side of the coin, the Promise of Obedience places an obligation on the Bishop to find suitable posts for each priest, and to ensure that they have somewhere to live and a reasonable income etc. It also means that when a priest retires or is sick, the diocese has to find appropriate accommodation, in an old people's home if necessary.

#### **Moving Parish**

#### Sacred Heart, Wimbledon

Sacred Heart, Wimbledon is numerically a very large parish, with three priests, two deacons, two religious sisters, a full time lay Administrator, a Faith Minister, and a site manager, not to mention various other people doing various jobs. There are three choirs, and there are 6 Sunday Masses (including Saturday evening).

The Parish was founded and run for decades by the Jesuits, who left about 10 years ago. There is a parish 2 form entry Primary School, as well as Wimbledon College (for boys, run by the Jesuits) and the Ursuline High School (for girls, run by the Ursulines), each with a prep school.

Some of you may be jumping for joy that I am leaving Sevenoaks, but I have been touched by the many emails and comments after Mass expressing your sadness that I am going. I shall be sad to leave Sevenoaks but at the same time I am looking ahead to fresh challenges.

I shall be replaced by Fr Piotr (Peter) Kucharski, until now Parish Priest of St Teresa's, Ashford, and I am sure that he will build on my legacy (unless the Holy Spirit again has other ideas!). I am sure too that you will give him, and Fr Vipin, the same support you have given me.

#### St Francis of Assisi Exhibition

Changing the subject, I recently visited the St Francis of Assisi exhibition at the National Gallery, and I recommend it. Book online in advance: the tickets are free, but they enable you to bypass the queues to enter the building. The artworks, extending from soon after St Francis' time to very modern works, are well worth seeing, and the exhibition enables one to discover details about St Francis that one had had either forgotten or never knew, and to learn afresh about his significance and influence.

### VENI CREATOR SPIRITUS BY JOHN DRYDEN

Creator Spirit, by whose aid The world's foundations first were laid, Come, visit ev'ry pious mind; Come, pour thy joys on human kind; From sin, and sorrow set us free; And make thy temples worthy Thee.

O, Source of uncreated Light, The Father's promis'd Paraclete! Thrice Holy Fount, thrice Holy Fire, Our hearts with heav'nly love inspire; Come, and thy Sacred Unction bring To sanctify us, while we sing!

Plenteous of grace, descend from high, Rich in thy sev'n-fold energy! Thou strength of his Almighty Hand, Whose pow'r does heav'n and earth command: Proceeding Spirit, our Defence, Who do'st the gift of tongues dispence, And crown'st thy gift with eloquence!

Refine and purge our earthly parts; But, oh, inflame and fire our hearts! Our frailties help, our vice control; Submit the senses to the soul; And when rebellious they are grown, Then, lay thy hand, and hold 'em down.

Chase from our minds th' Infernal Foe; And peace, the fruit of love, bestow; And, lest our feet should step astray, Protect, and guide us in the way.

Make us Eternal Truths receive, And practise, all that we believe: Give us thy self, that we may see The Father and the Son, by thee.

Immortal honour, endless fame, Attend th' Almighty Father's name: The Saviour Son be glorified, Who for lost Man's redemption died: And equal adoration be, Eternal Paraclete, to thee.

John Dryden (1631 – 1700) was a poet, dramatist, critic, and translator. He was England's first Poet Laureate, and was the dominant writer of Restoration England. He converted to Catholicism in 1686, and wrote the poem 'The Hind and the Panther' in 1687 to celebrate his conversion. He wrote this translation of the traditional Latin hymn for Pentecost in 1693.
