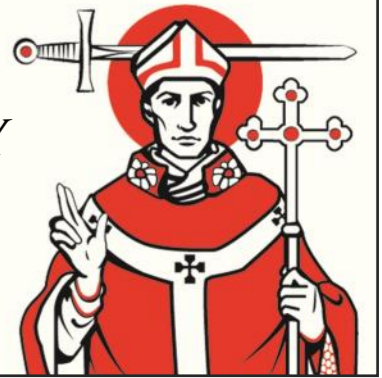

Today's Mass: CORPUS et SANGUIS CHRISTI

Deuteronomy 8: 2-3, 14-16, *Psalms* 147, *1 Corinthians* 10: 16-17, optional Sequence *Lauda Sion*, *John* 6: 51-58

Today we reflect on one of the greatest mysteries of our Catholic faith: the Most Holy Body and Blood of Christ. Mass today may end with a Procession of the Blessed Sacrament.

In the **First Reading** Moses reminds the people - and us - that God fed them with manna from heaven during their forty years in the wilderness. They - and we - also need another bread: the Word of God.

The **Psalms** is a psalm of praise, doubtless chosen because of its reference to God feeding us "*with finest wheat*".

Second Reading: St Paul elucidates the meaning of communion. In Holy Communion we have vertical communion with God, and horizontal communion with one another.

There is a **Sequence** today, the '*Lauda Sion*', which is optional, and may be shortened. It was composed by St Thomas Aquinas, and is a hymn telling of Christ's institution of the Eucharist and our Catholic belief in transubstantiation.

The **Gospel** passage, which comes after the Feeding of the Five Thousand, portrays Jesus explicitly talking about the Eucharist: His bread "*is my flesh, for the life of the world*". This clear teaching of the Lord is the basis of our doctrine of the Real Presence of Christ in the Eucharist.

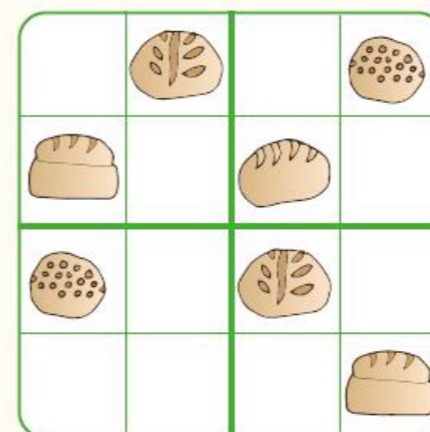
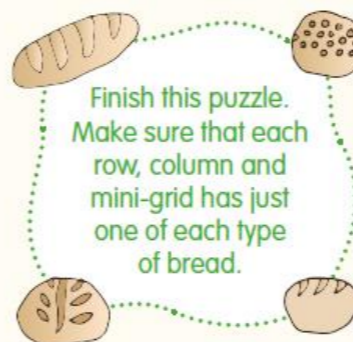

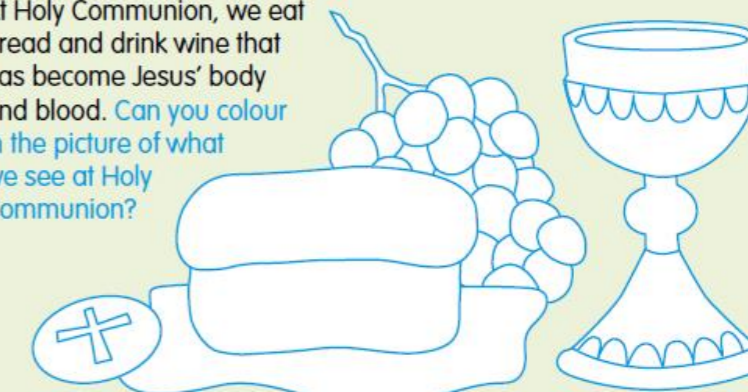

From the Desk of the Parish Priest

Children at Mass

What follows is closely based on an article by Joseph Shaw in *Catholic Answers*, a website I chanced upon by accident (or providence). I hope Dr Shaw doesn't mind my plagiarism, as I agree very much with what he wrote.

Is bringing small children to Mass a good idea?

Children under the 'age of reason' (usually 7) are not bound in Church to law to attend Mass on Sundays, but often parents have no choice but to bring them to attend Mass themselves. But if parents had the choice, is better to bring children to Mass or leave them at home?

One consideration is the importance of attending Mass as a family: children need to see their parents kneeling before Our Lord on the Altar. Also, children need to learn how to behave in Church. Thirdly, small children benefit spiritually from the Liturgy: they begin to develop the virtues of prayer and attention, and they receive the blessings which come from Mass attendance. The absolution after the *I Confess* and the Blessing at the end apply to children as much as to adults.

We live in a world which almost worships rationalism, so we need to counteract this. The Sacraments give graces to those who attend, they combat the influence of the Devil, and are an encounter with the living Lord. It follows that children of all ages should accompany their parents to Mass.

The culture and expectations of everyone at Mass

The *whole* community needs to buy into this, not just parents. Non-parents must compromise and learn to tolerate some noise from babies and toddlers: you may wish for complete silence in order to pray without distraction (you can always come to Adoration for that), but tut-tutting and sour looks discourage parents and make their job harder.

We don't have cry chapels in any of our four Churches. In any case, their use is a bit dubious, as it segregates young families off from the rest of the community and it doesn't help small children to develop good habits of prayerfulness.

Of course, if a baby is screaming its head off it may be necessary to take him or her out to the Entrance or a side room for a while until it calms down. If this is necessary, just do it without fuss and without dirty looks from others. Parents in this situation are not bad parents, just parents with a baby!

For infants we have the children's page in the Newsletter, which – with a pencil – can keep them occupied, especially during the Readings and Homily.

If the Mass is celebrated reverently and prayerfully by everyone – Priest, Altar Servers, Readers and Ministers, musicians and all present – this will rub off on young people. They will learn to be quiet, prayerful, and attentive to the action of the Mass, and by the time of their first Holy Communion will have a genuine sense of encountering the 'Other' in Mass.

The community includes everyone

Parents, like all Catholics over 7 and not impeded by illness or lack of transport, should attend Mass every Sunday and Holyday. Parents with small children are just as much part of our community, of the People of God, as anyone else. The last thing we want to do is to drive them out of churches when they are struggling with small children. If they feel rejected they won't return. As Dr Shaw puts it, "*if we don't welcome parents, there will not be another generation of Catholics*".

I think Our Blessed Lord would agree! See *Matthew 21:15-16: But when the chief priests and the teachers of the law saw the wonderful things He did and the children shouting in the temple courts, "Hosanna to the Son of David," they were indignant. "Do you hear what these children are saying?" they asked him. "Yes," replied Jesus, "have you never read, "From the lips of children and infants you, Lord, have called forth your praise'.*

ON THE FEAST OF CORPUS CHRISTI BY ST THOMAS AQUINAS

O precious and wonderful banquet!

Since it was the will of God's only-begotten Son that men should share in his divinity, he assumed our nature in order that by becoming man he might make men gods. Moreover, when he took our flesh he dedicated the whole of its substance to our salvation. He offered his body to God the Father on the altar of the cross as a sacrifice for our reconciliation. He shed his blood for our ransom and purification, so that we might be redeemed from our wretched state of bondage and cleansed from all sin. But to ensure that the memory of so great a gift would abide with us for ever, he left his body as food and his blood as drink for the faithful to consume in the form of bread and wine.

O precious and wonderful banquet, that brings us salvation and contains all sweetness! Could anything be of more intrinsic value? Under the old law it was the flesh of calves and goats that was offered, but here Christ himself, the true God, is set before us as our food. What could be more wonderful than this? No other sacrament has greater healing power; through it sins are purged away, virtues are increased, and the soul is enriched with an abundance of every spiritual gift. It is offered in the Church for the living and the dead, so that what was instituted for the salvation of all may be for the benefit of all. Yet, in the end, no one can fully express the sweetness of this sacrament, in which spiritual delight is tasted at its very source, and in which we renew the memory of that surpassing love for us which Christ revealed in his passion.

It was to impress the vastness of this love more firmly upon the hearts of the faithful that our Lord instituted this sacrament at the Last Supper. As he was on the point of leaving the world to go to the Father, after celebrating the Passover with his disciples, he left it as a perpetual memorial of his passion. It was the fulfilment of ancient figures and the greatest of all his miracles, while for those who were to experience the sorrow of his departure, it was destined to be a unique and abiding consolation.

St. Thomas Aquinas, *Opusculum 57, in festo Corporis Christi*, lectures 1-4

Saint Thomas Aquinas (1226-1274), "the Angelic Doctor", was a priest in the Order of St. Dominic and served the Church as a great scholar and teacher. For his service he is honoured by Mother Church who has bestowed upon him the title "Doctor of the Church." The document above is a reading included in the Roman Liturgy's "Office of Readings" for the Feast of Corpus Christi. It is taken from a sermon written by St. Thomas Aquinas in commemoration of the liturgical feast of Corpus Christi (the Feast of the Most Holy Body and Blood of Christ) which was instituted during his lifetime.
