

Today's Mass: TWENTY-FOURTH SUNDAY OF THE YEAR (A)

First Reading: Ecclesiasticus 27:33-28:9 In the first reading, we are reminded of the importance of forgiveness and mercy in our lives. Just as the Lord shows us His mercy, we are called to extend forgiveness to others, letting go of grudges and finding peace in reconciliation.

Psalm 102(103): 1-4,9-12 The psalm invites us to praise the Lord for His compassion and forgiveness. It reminds us of God's loving nature, which is slow to anger and abounding in steadfast love. As we seek forgiveness, let us also be channels of forgiveness in our interactions with others.

Second Reading: Romans 14:7-9 St. Paul emphasizes that we do not live for ourselves alone but for the Lord. Our actions and decisions should reflect our commitment to Christ. In our relationships and choices, let us strive to bring glory to God.

Gospel: Matthew 18:21-35 In today's Gospel, Jesus teaches about the boundless nature of forgiveness. Peter asks how many times he should forgive, and Jesus responds with the parable of the unforgiving servant, highlighting the importance of forgiving others as God forgives us.

This Sunday's readings call us to a profound reflection on forgiveness and mercy. We are reminded that forgiveness is not just a duty but a reflection of God's love and mercy in our lives. As we gather in worship, let us examine our hearts and be open to extending forgiveness to those who have wronged us, just as God forgives us. In doing so, we contribute to building a community of love, reconciliation, and peace within the Church.

"Behold how good and pleasant it is when God's people live together in unity!" Psalm 133


The purpose of this communication is:
