

Today's Mass: TWENTY-SEVENTH SUNDAY OF THE YEAR (A)

Ah, who doesn't enjoy a good glass of wine with a hearty meal? Much like a well-chosen vintage can elevate dinner, the Word of this Sunday adds depth and nuance to our spiritual lives. This Sunday we're looking at a vineyard as an age-old metaphor—present in both the Old and New Testaments—to understand the intricate relationship between God, Israel, and the Church.

Imagine God as the owner of a prized vineyard, which in this case represents the house of Israel. This isn't just any vineyard; it's one that God Himself prepared and tended to, safeguarded by the walls of Jerusalem and overseen by the mighty Temple. The aim? To produce good grapes, or in spiritual terms, a harvest of righteous and holy lives. But here's the twist—the vineyard disappoints. It fails to produce the 'good grapes' that God was so eager to see.

Jesus concludes the story from where the prophet Isaiah left off. The current tenants—the religious leaders of Israel—haven't been great stewards. Far from nurturing the vineyard, they've been quite destructive, killing off the prophets sent by God to help gather a faithful harvest. Jesus warns that the tenants will commit the ultimate act of betrayal: killing the owner's son outside the vineyard. And the fallout? The vineyard—also known as the Kingdom of God—will be handed over to new caretakers, the Church's leaders, who will finally produce the fruit God always intended.

So where do we fit in? Well, each of us is like a vine in this grand vineyard, attached to Christ, the true vine. We're called to produce fruits of righteousness and to be the 'first fruits' of a new creation. But let's not get lost in the weeds—or in this case, the thorns and thistles of worldly distractions. To borrow from Thomas Merton, "Happiness is not a matter of intensity but of balance, order, rhythm and harmony." It's about finding that balance and harmony in our lives, aligning our earthly actions with heavenly aspirations, and always rejoicing that God's presence provides ultimate comfort and joy.

PRISONERS' SUNDAY

'I was in prison and you visited me', Matt, 25:36.

The Catholic Bishops invite all parishes across England and Wales to pray for people in prison, as well as their children and families. A combination of COVID and a high level of staff absences across the Prison Service combined with prison overcrowding means that prisoners spend an ever increasing proportion of their days in prison with 23 hours in their cell being common and visits plus jobs or educational courses suspended.

The Prison Advice and Care Trust (PACT) is the national catholic charity which provides caring services to men and women, to people with convictions on release, to their children and families. The importance of this task is illustrated by the following: re-offending by prisoners with family relationships is 39% lower than the average.

PACT provides visitor centres outside prisons & a 24/7 helpline for families - 36,000 calls last year, almost all answered remotely from their home by volunteers. Last year, PACT consulted prisoners in participating prisons on which gift from a list their child might like for Christmas. Gifts were purchased by PACT, wrapped by prisoners in a special session in the visitors' hall and given out at visiting time.

There are 80,000 prisoners in England & Wales of whom c. 15-16,000 are Catholic. We have 11 prisons in Southwark Diocese - including Maidstone Prison which specialises in foreign nationals so language skills can be useful too. PACT needs volunteers to assist with family services, to accompany Catholic chaplains to mass, to visit or speak on the phone to prisoners and to mentor ex-prisoners. One specific programme run by a sister charity is the Welcome Directory in which faith communities become accredited to welcome ex-prisoners and provide mentoring services (jobs, debts, food etc) - but there are currently very few accredited Catholic parishes.

Is there something among these tasks you might be able to help with? Would you perhaps like to receive PACT's magazine, Fresh Start or to participate in a Justpeople workshop to discern what you might like to participate in with no strings attached? Should we be thinking about a prison-Parish partnership for our parish?
