

CHRIST THE KING OF THE UNIVERSE & YOUTH SUNDAY

As we approach the Solemnity of Christ the King, I want to share with you, especially the youth and the young, why this day is more than just a date on our lituraical calendar. It's a call to each of us, no matter our age, to recognise and celebrate the profound truth that Jesus Christ is not just a historical figure, but a living King, reigning over all aspects of our lives.

Pope Pius XI established this feast in 1925, a time not unlike our own, full of uncertainties and challenges. The world was reeling from the aftermath of a devastating war, societies were in turmoil, and many felt a deep sense of hopelessness. Pope Pius XI saw the need to remind everyone, young and old, that despite the chaos, Christ reigns as an eternal King, a source of hope and guidance.

Why this matters for the young? You are living in and exploring a beautiful world, but one buzzing with information and misinformation, with opportunities and challenges. Sometimes, it might feel overwhelming to make sense of it all. But remember, you're not alone in this journey. Christ the King is not a distant ruler; He's a guide, a friend, and a source of strength, especially when things get tough. Remember, that you have unique perspectives and ideas that are invaluable to our parish. Whether it's through joining parish groups, joining the ministry at the altar or participating in discussions, your involvement brings fresh energy and insights. Sometimes, faith might seem like an old tradition, disconnected from the modern world. But the truth of Christ's kinaship is timeless. It's about finding peace, purpose, and joy in a world that often overlooks these values. Just as Christ brings light into our lives, you too can be a source of hope and positivity in your circles, whether at school, university, place of work, your own family, in your neighbourhood, or on social media.

Why this matters for us all? Our role in nurturing the faith of the young generation is crucial. They learn from our example, our words, and our actions. Weather you are a parent, grandparent, parish leader or a long-standing parishioner, there are at least three things you should embrace in making the Kingdom of the Lord Jesus present:

- 1) Motivate the young and the old to be active in parish activities and to explore their faith through different means like art, music, and community service.
- 2) Engage in open conversations about faith, possible doubts, and faith-inspiring ideas. Your willingness to listen can be incredibly affirming.
- 3) Be Role Models. Show people, especially the young, what it means to live out one's faith in everyday life. Our example is a powerful tool in guiding them on their spiritual journey.

As we celebrate the Solemnity of Christ the King and the Youth Sunday 2023, let's remember it's more than acknowledging Christ's reign. It's about actively inviting Him into our daily lives, spreading His message of love and hope, and showing to the youth, that they are not just the future of the Church; they are a vital part of its present. Together, let's journey in faith, united under the loving reign of Christ the King, growing in love, wisdom, and service to one another.

PARISH CENTRE FUNDRAISING

Final Days of Parish Centre Fundraising - the fundraising campaign for the refurbishment of the Parish Centre will conclude with the Taizé concert at St Thomas's church on Friday 1st December (see separate notice for details of the concert). Our sincere thanks for the tremendous response from parishioners so far, and we can confirm that the original £75,000 fundraising target has been reached. We have been blessed by some large donations and many small to medium size donations.

However, given the age of the building and limited maintenance over the years, we have identified some additional remedial work; mainly because of water ingress into the fabric of the building- made worse by the (biblical) amount of rain we get. The ridge where the Church roof and Parish centre roof meet, seem to have leaked for many years and so needs urgent repair. There is no point in refurbishing Parish rooms if the Church roof is leaking and water is flowing into the Parish room. Also, the guttering around the entire building is broken. Such maintenance would be required even if we were not doing the Parish room refurbishment. All the details of the additional costs and quotes are on the Parish website.
