



In this sacred season of Advent, as we anticipate the birth of Christ, the figure of John the Baptist becomes increasingly significant. His role, as delineated in recent readings, is not about who he is in himself but rather who he is not. He is not Elijah returned, nor the prophet foretold by Moses, nor the Messiah. Instead, he is the one who prepares the way for the Lord. But what truly resonates in these readings is the concept of light. John came to testify to the light, a call that extends to each of us. Yet, in the face of societal pressures and personal fears, testifying to this light can be daunting, even among long-standing friends and within our own hearts. We must confront our own darkness, not with pride or resignation, but with a determination to seek the light.

This pursuit of light is not a solitary endeavour. It involves turning to God to rekindle the brightness within us, to enhance our faith, hope, and love. Gratitude plays a crucial role here, serving as a beacon in our souls. It's about acknowledging our struggles - the disappointments of life, our personal battles with sin, and the weariness of daily existence – and seeking divine assistance to overcome these challenges.

John the Baptist, a paradigm of trust, knew his role in God's plan and focused solely on it without being overwhelmed by the bigger picture. His every appearance in the Bible urges us to deepen our trust in God, to discern our role in His design, especially as it evolves with the changing seasons of our lives. Seeking clarity in our purpose is a journey grounded in trust.

Trust, the virtue of the day, is not just a passive belief but an active reliance on God's ability, reliability, and integrity. It's about echoing the plea of the father in the Gospel who sought healing for his son, "Lord, I believe, help my unbelief." This mantra, repeated earnestly, becomes a powerful tool in strengthening our faith. The gospel of Jesus Christ remains as radical and relevant today as it ever was. Our challenge is to step into the world with a trust in God that astonishes others. But more than that, it's about being more than just ourselves; it's about striving to be the best versions of ourselves, fully realising the potential that God has planted within each of us.

As we journey through Advent, let us embrace the light that John the Baptist heralded, the light that Christ brings into the world, and let that light shine brightly in our lives, dispelling the darkness that so often seeks to envelop us.

GETTING READY FOR CHRISTMAS

oon, after the busyness of Advent, comes the much-expected and joyful Christmas. Decorated Christmas trees are everywhere you look. Presents crowd for space under the tree and families come together for a turkey feast. Undeniably Christmas is one of the most important Christian and cultural holidays of the year, but what is the true meaning of Christmas? Is it the gifts? Is it the family coming together? Or maybe the fun time we have?

Why do we celebrate Christmas? Is it not because of Jesus, the Son of God, who came to save us from our sins?

Christmas literally means *Christian Mass*. It's a shortened form of Christ's Mass. Christmas is a time of spiritual reflection on the important foundations of the Christian faith. It's also a *celebration*. It's when Christians celebrate God's love for the world through the birth of the baby Jesus. The Bible tells of his birth hundreds of years before, fulfilling prophecies; and is recorded in Luke 2:4-19.

Jesus was born in order to pay the price for the things we have done wrong: sin. God sent his only son to be the atonement for all our sins so that we would not be separated from God. Without Jesus, we would all die for our sins. We inherited our sinful nature from the first human beings God created, Adam and Eve. While being fully God and yet fully man, Jesus came into the world as an infant to save us all.

Although people worldwide celebrate Christ's birth on December 25th, it was likely that he was born on a different month and date. The church in the 4th century chose December 25th as it coordinated with the Solstice on the Roman Calendar.

For Christians, the true meaning of Christmas is the celebration of the Saviour, Jesus Christ. We know that through belief in Christ we are daughters and sons of God. Heaven will one day be our home. Perhaps this will help you look at the Christmas season differently this year. A chance to truly take in the wonder and awe of the season.

Most Christmas traditions vary in significance and symbolic meaning. For example, we exchange gifts because God sent us the most precious gift: his only Son. Also, three wise men visited Jesus and brought gifts as well. We focus on so many aspects of Christmas that when the time comes to say a Christmas dinner blessing, we do not necessarily make the most of the opportunity. While we may feel like simply breathing a sigh of relief, maybe it's time to look at those few moments before we eat and take it up a notch. Why not make it thoughtful and meaningful? Why not take a little time to plan it out? So, what will you pray about / for at your Christmas family dinner?
