Think of how marriage was often understood as a legal contract rather than a love commitment: how corporal punishment was acceptable; how the husband had more rights than his wife. It was he who made the marriage proposal, sought her father's permission to marry, put a ring on her finger, symbolising she was now his and would take his name. In many countries, marital rape was protected by law.

Thankfully, the situation has improved. We are more aware today of the complexity of the human condition, that relationships and family life are not always straightforward. Even the best families have their troubles.

In his letter about marriage and the family, Amoris laetitia (The Joy of Love), Pope Francis uses three expressions that are helpful to

The first is 'wounded families.' Families are not perfect, Pope Francis stresses. Try as we might, we are not perfect. We know from hard experience that the ideal of Christian marriage

Lord, help me to always treat those closest to me with love and

The feast of the Holy Family was instituted in 1921, and has been celebrated on the first Sunday after Christmas since 1969. The Holy Family is seen as the model for the human family, the religious community and the Church itself. The feast is a celebration not only of the Holy Family itself but of the ideal of the Christian family on which the Church has always placed great emphasis.

and family life is hard to live, and people fall out and relationships suffer. Pope Francis calls them "wounded families," and says we must "avoid judgements which do not take into account the complexity of various situations" and "be attentive to how people experience distress because of their condition."

All families are wounded, and Pope Francis says it's okay to admit it. His letter is not a simple rehash of Church teaching on marriage and sexuality. It acknowledges our broken humanity. Perfection, as individuals or as families, is impossible this side of the grave.

The second expression is 'gradualism.' Families are a work in progress, the pope says. No family drops down from heaven perfectly formed; "families need constantly to grow and mature in the ability to love ... All of us are called to keep striving towards something greater than ourselves and our families, and every family must feel this constant impulse." We must always aim at being better - to grow all the time in holiness, patience, compassion, understanding, perfection. The Holy Family itself was a work in progress.

The third expression is 'field hospital.' The Church must be a field hospital that cleans and heals people's wounds. So many families are wounded - members who don't talk to each other, or who hurt each other, members who disappoint those they love, or make decisions that let them down. The family is the primary battlefield where these hurts are experienced. So the family must be the primary field hospital that cleans and heals these wounds. It means a willingness to forgive, to talk, to listen, to spend quality time together, to understand differences, to appreciate one another. Each family must be a field hospital that never allows wounds to fester



#### DO

Reach out to a family member with whom you may have a difficult relationship.

#### PRAY

Pray for families everywhere, that they may grow in holiness and love. Pray for families in distress.
