

WHAT IS CANDLEMAS?

Candlemas Day, celebrated on February 2nd each year, holds a special place in the Christian calendar, particularly for Catholics. This feast, also known as the Feast of the Presentation of the Lord, used to mark the end of the liturgical Christmas season, before the reform of the Roman Catholic Liturgy.

The Feast of the Presentation commemorates the day when Mary and Joseph brought the infant Jesus to the temple in Jerusalem. This event, occurring forty days after His birth, followed the prescriptions of the Torah for purification and dedication. According to the Book of Leviticus, a woman was considered "unclean" after giving birth to a child. The child was circumcised on the eighth day, and the mother remained at home for another 33 days. After this period, the parents went to the temple for purification rites, including a sacrifice, which for a poorer family like Mary and Joseph, was two pigeons or turtledoves.

Additionally, the Torah required the redemption of the first-born son, a symbolic act acknowledging God's claim over the first-born, in memory of the Passover in Egypt. While St. Luke's Gospel focuses on the presentation aspect rather than this redemption, it highlights the consecration of Jesus to God and prefigures His future as the priest who would offer Himself for humanity's salvation.

An integral part of the Presentation narrative is the figure of Simeon, a righteous and devout man who was promised by the Holy Spirit that he would not die before he had seen the Messiah. When Mary and Joseph brought Jesus to the temple, Simeon recognized Him as the light for revelation to the Gentiles and the glory of Israel. His words to Mary, foretelling that a sword would pierce her soul, underscore the bittersweet nature of this event, revealing both the salvation and suffering that would come through Jesus.

Candlemas is steeped in rich traditions. Since at least the seventh century, candles have been blessed during Mass on this day, to be used

throughout the year, hence the name "Candlemas." These candles symbolise Christ as the light of the world and serve as a reminder for Christians to be bearers of this light. In several Eastern European countries, Candlemas still marks the traditional end of Christmas celebrations. A custom started by Saint John Paul II includes keeping the Nativity scene displayed until this day.

Today, Candlemas invites reflection on themes of purification, light, and dedication. It mirrors the experience of Christian baptism, where individuals are dedicated to God and called to be lights in the world. The feast remind us of both joy of the celebration and reflection, as it remembers Jesus' first entrance into the temple, foreshadowing His ultimate sacrifice and His role as a beacon of hope and salvation for all humanity.

For us, contemporary Catholics, Candlemas is a call to embody the light of Christ in a complex world. This feast, commemorating Jesus' presentation and the fulfillment of ancient prophecies, invites us to renew our commitment to living our faith actively and purposefully. It challenges us to bring the light of hope, compassion, and justice into our communities, reflecting the transformative power of Christ's love in our daily actions. In celebrating Candlemas, we are reminded of our role as bearers of this divine light, entrusted with the mission to illuminate the darkness of our times with the enduring brightness of our faith.
