



On this first Sunday of Lent the Gospel reading (Mark 1:12-15) tells us, that the Spirit immediately drove Jesus out into the wilderness, and he was in the wilderness forty days, tempted by Satan, and he was with the wild beasts, and the angels ministered to him. Then, after John was arrested, Jesus came into Galilee, preaching the gospel of God and saying, 'The time is fulfilled, and the kingdom of God is at hand. Repent and believe in the gospel.'

There's that word 'repent'. We see it often throughout the gospel. See it, particularly during the season of Lent leading up to a Holy Week each year. What does it mean? It means to turn back to God.

It's amazing how we can turn away from God by degrees. It's not that we turn our back completely on God. It's not that we reject God completely, but it's easy to turn away from God by degrees. It's easy to turn away from God in a little thing. And then, of course, if we turn away from God in many little things, then we can find ourselves disoriented. Why? Because we turn away from God, we get disoriented. We lose track of which way is north and which way is true north.

And so to ask ourselves today, "How do we turn away from God in little ways?" And to hear the call of repentance, not necessarily as a huge thing. It can be at some times in our lives, and it may need to be that at this time in your life. But it may be these micro repentances, these micro turning back to God when we feel tempted to turn away from God can have a very powerful effect in aligning us with God, in aligning us with the will of God, and aligning us with the best version of ourselves.

May God bless us on this journey through Lent 2024. Let us try to bring back the very best version of ourself, all that God created us to be.

## God I eads us into the desert

The liturgical period of Lent is a time of preparation for the proper experience of the great Paschal mysteries. It is meant to help us open up even more to God and our neighbour. Lent is a good time to draw closer to the Lord God, to draw strength and courage from Him for the journey ahead. However, to do this, one must stop and calm one's interior, which is usually immersed in the fervour of daily matters and the events that consume us, including political and social ones. It's not about worshiping God with lips only, but being close to Him with our hearts (cf. Mk 7:6).

God leads us into the desert in this Lenten time to teach greater trust in Himself and in the plan He has for each of us without exception. It's about not just believing in God, because even Satan believes in Him, but to learn to believe God, to trust that He really knows what is good for us. Then His words will be a simple and unambiguous signpost for us in all matters in which we have to make decisions.

Lent is also a time of greater openness to others, especially the sick, those in need, suffering physically or spiritually. By stopping in the daily rush, we suddenly begin to notice also the people around us, their suffering, sometimes helplessness, incompetence, weakness. Perhaps we will manage to see those who are waiting for our time and interest, as well as for concrete help.

The Lenten devotions offered by the Church, such as the Stations of the Cross, meditations, holy hours, retreats and days of focus, are all meant to help us in knowing and deepening God's love, which was fully revealed on the Cross. Being aware of the love God has bestowed upon us, we can more easily open up and turn to Him, and thus try to imitate Him in this love.

In this Lenten time, the saints teach us how to go through "the night of the soul", accepting the poverty of faith. Pope Francis spoke about this at the recent Wednesday audience, in another catechesis on vices, this time dedicated to acedia, which is often wrongly identified with laziness. The Holy Father reminded us that acedia means "lack of care about one's own being" and is a very dangerous temptation, resembling depression.

Pope Francis pointed out that a person who falls victim to acedia feels as if crushed by the desire for death: experiences disgust for everything. Her relationship with God becomes boring for her; even the holiest acts, which warmed her heart in the past, now seem completely useless to her. A person begins to regret the passing time and youth that has irretrievably gone by.

Acedia is defined as the "noonday demon." It strikes us in the middle of the day when fatigue reaches its zenith, and the coming hours seem monotonous, impossible to live through. It very much resembles the evil of depression, both from a psychological and philosophical point of view. "Indeed, for those who have fallen into acedia, life loses its meaning, prayer seems boring, every battle seems pointless. Even if we nurtured passions in our youth, now they seem like dreams that did not make us happy. So, we give up, and distraction, not thinking, seem to be the only way out: one would like to be stunned, to have a completely empty mind" — explained the Holy Father comparing acedia to premature dying.

Masters of spirituality propose various remedies for the dangerous vice of acedia. The most important seems to be the patience of faith. Even when under the influence of acedia we want to escape from reality, we must have the courage to persevere and accept in my "here and now" the presence of God. Monks say that for them the cell is the best teacher of life, because it is the place that concretely and daily tells you about your love story with the Lord. Acedia is a decisive battle that must be won at all costs.

Well, we mustn't forget that faith tormented by the experience of acedia does not lose its value. On the contrary, it is true faith, very human faith, which despite everything, despite the darkness that blinds it, still humbly believes.
