



As we embrace the 4th Sunday of Lent, also known as Laetare Sunday, our hearts are filled with anticipatory joy. "Laetare" means "Rejoice" in Latin, and on this day, the Church invites us to look forward with hope to the Resurrection. The Gospel of John 3:14-21, speak profoundly to this joy, reminding us of God's immense love, symbolized through the lifting up of the Son of Man, so that everyone who believes may have eternal life. This message of salvation and light overcoming darkness is a beacon of hope as we draw nearer to Easter.

In the midst of this joyful anticipation, we continue our journey with the Elect through the RCIA process, marking the Second Scrutiny (Sunday 11:15am Mass). The Second Scrutiny, intended to heal and purify, is accompanied by the Gospel of John 9:1-41 - the healing of the man born blind. This passage is chosen specifically for its thematic focus on enlightenment and sight given by Christ, reflecting the inner illumination the Elect are experiencing. It diverges from the usual Year B readings to emphasize the transformative journey of the Elect, as they, like the blind man, come to see the world anew through the light of Christ.

Laetare Sunday also coincides with Mothering Sunday, a day when we honor and give thanks for all mothers and mother figures who nurture and guide us in our lives. Tracing its roots back to the 16th century, it was originally a day when people would visit their "mother" church or cathedral for a special service, symbolically reuniting families and communities. Today, it serves as a heartfelt occasion to express gratitude and love to our mothers, recognizing their unwavering care and influence in our lives.

To all mothers in our parish and beyond, we extend our warmest wishes and prayers for joy, peace, and fulfillment. May this Laetare Sunday be a source of light and joy for you and your loved ones, as we journey together towards the glorious celebration of Easter.

UNDERSTANDING SUFFERING PART THREE

SUFFERING IN THE CHURCH

John Paul II also draws our attention to the fact that suffering in union with Christ also introduces us into the Mystery of the Church – the mystical Body of Christ. In this Body, Christ wants to be united with all men. Especially, however, He is united with those who suffer. He who suffers in union with Christ not only draws his strength from Christ but also "completes" with his suffering "the afflictions of Christ". Here, the truth about the creative character of suffering is particularly emphasized.

The Pope makes us aware that the suffering of Christ created the good of the Redemption of the world. This good in itself is inexhaustible and infinite. No man can add anything to the good of Redemption. At the same time, however, in the mystery of the Church as His Body, Christ somehow opened His own redemptive suffering to every human suffering. As far as man becomes a participant in the sufferings of Christ — in any place in the world and any time in history — in his own way, he completes that suffering through which Christ accomplished the Redemption of the world.

Redemption, accomplished by the power of atoning love, is always open to any love that is expressed in human suffering. In this dimension of love, Redemption, which was fully accomplished, somehow continually

accomplishes anew. Therefore, suffering has a special value in the face of the Church.

SUFFERING AND RESURRECTION

According to the successor of St.

Peter, suffering has been especially included in the victory over the world, as revealed in the Resurrection. Christ retains in his resurrected body the marks of the wounds

of the Cross on his hands, feet, and side. Through the Resurrection, He reveals the victorious power of suffering and tries to breathe this conviction into the hearts of those He chose as His Apostles, and those He continually chooses and sends.

The witnesses of the Cross and Resurrection of Christ left the Church and humanity a specific gospel of suffering. It was written by the Redeemer first with his own suffering undertaken out of love. This suffering, together with the living word of teaching, became a rich source for participants in the sufferings of Jesus in the first and all subsequent generations of His disciples and followers.

Through the ages and generations, it has been found that suffering contains a special power that inwardly brings a person closer to Christ, a special grace. Man discovers the salvific meaning of suffering, but above all, that in suffering he becomes a completely new person. He finds as if a new measure of his entire life and calling. This discovery is a special confirmation of the spiritual greatness that is in man, which is quite disproportionately greater than the body. Then, when this body is deeply sick, completely disabled, and the person is as if incapable of living and acting, this inner maturity and spiritual greatness are even more emphasized, constituting a moving lesson for healthy and normal people.

According to John Paul II, in the face of his suffering brother or sister, Christ gradually opens and unfolds the horizons of the kingdom of God: a world converted to the Creator, a world freed from sin, built on the salvific power of love. And to this world, to this kingdom of the Father, Christ slowly but effectively introduces the suffering man, as if through the very heart of his suffering.

As a man takes up his cross, spiritually uniting with the Cross of Christ, the salvific meaning of suffering is revealed to him. Then also man finds in his suffering inner peace, and even spiritual joy.

The source of joy becomes overcoming the sense of the uselessness of suffering, a feeling that is very strongly rooted in human suffering. The discovery of the salvific meaning of suffering in union with Christ transforms this depressing feeling. The Pope draws our attention to the fact that faith in participation in the sufferings of Christ carries within it this inner certainty that the suffering man

"completes the afflictions of Christ", that in the spiritual dimension of the work of Redemption serves, like Christ, the salvation of his brothers and sisters. (...) And therefore, the Church sees in all suffering brothers and sisters of Christ as if a manifold subject of its supernatural power.

The more man is threatened by sin, the heavier structures of sin he carries within himself in the contemporary world, the greater the eloquence within himself of human suffering. And the more the Church feels the need to appeal to human sufferings for the salvation of the world.
