



Jesus in this Sunday's Gospel teaches His apostles how to interpret the Scriptures. He tells them that all the Scriptures of what we now call the Old Testament refer to Him. He says that all the promises found in the Old Testament have been fulfilled in His Passion, death, and Resurrection. And He tells them that these Scriptures foretell the mission of the Church—to preach forgiveness of sins to all the nations, beginning at Jerusalem.

In today's First Reading and Epistle, we see the beginnings of that mission. And we see the apostles interpreting the Scriptures as Jesus taught them to. God has brought to fulfillment what He announced beforehand in all the prophets, Peter preaches. His sermon is shot through with Old Testament images. He evokes Moses and the Exodus, in which God revealed himself as the ancestral God of Abraham, Isaac, and Jacob (see Exodus 3:6, 15). He identifies Jesus as Isaiah's suffering servant who has been glorified (see Isaiah 52:13).

John, too, describes Jesus in Old Testament terms. Alluding to how Israel's priests offered blood sacrifices to atone for the people's sins (see Leviticus 16; Hebrews 9–10), he says that Jesus intercedes for us before God (see Romans 8:34), and that His blood is a sacrificial expiation for the sins of the world (see 1 John 1:7).

Notice that in all three readings, the Scriptures are interpreted to serve and advance the Church's mission—to reveal the truth about Jesus, to bring people to repentance, the wiping away of sins, and the perfection of their love for God. This is how we, too, should hear the Scriptures. Not to know more "about" Jesus, but to truly know Him personally, and to know His plan for our lives.

THE YEAR OF PRAYER

In preparation for the 2025 Jubilee Year 'Pilgrims of Hope', the Holy Father has asked that 2024 be year of prayer, starting from Advent 2023 and focusing on the Lord's Prayer (Our Father...)

The Lord's Prayer offers us a great opportunity to go back to the basics of prayer, as the oldest and most important prayer of Christians, the result of a unique lesson that Jesus gave to his disciples over 2000 years ago.

We know it by heart, we have uttered it from our mouths and hearts hundreds of times. But does that mean we know everything about it?

To this day, three texts have been preserved in which the Lord's Prayer is present. The first two, which the average believer is likely aware of, are of course the Gospels of Matthew and Luke. And there's also the Luke's version. But few know that there is another of this prayer. Didache, also known as the Teaching of the Twelve Apostles, is a short, anonymous treatise of ancient Christianity. It is one of the earliest writings of the Apostolic Fathers. They began to write their texts directly after the apostolic times, invoking the authority of the apostles. Especially that of the longest-lived amona them, John. However, their writings did not enter the canon of the New Testament. Including the Didache containing the Lord's Prayer. Today, it is simply treated as an apocryphal text. The Lord's Prayer is in the eighth chapter. It is recommended to recite this prayer three times a day.

There is also something called doxology. It is a phrase that is added at the end of the Lord's Prayer during litural or during normal, private recitation: For Yours is the kingdom and the power and the glory forever. Amen. This was incorporated into the text of the Gospel of Matthew around the 3rd century. Why? A theory explains that a certain copyist, while transcribing the manuscript of the Gospel, most likely unwittingly added to the prayer words with which he himself prayed at gatherings. And because of such a possibility, in contemporary editions of the NT, the text of the doxology is not included. Which does not mean that it cannot be used. It can. And it is used in many communities including Church of England.

The words of Our Father prayer are key in changing our perception of God. Until now, He was God the Creator, Judge, Almighty, Just. From the moment Jesus gave us this prayer, we can also treat God as a Father. And if God is our Father, it means that we are His children. And that means He certainly loves us. And that He will do everything to make us happy. A revolution.

Now that we know who God is, let's find out where to start building a relationship with Him. Nothing in the Lord's Prayer is by chance. The order of the petitions too. The most important task of creation is to praise the Creator. To give Him glory. Essentially, the main reason for the great universe and the small man at its centre is God's glory. And God's glory is best revealed in the love of our neighbour, as Jesus reminded us. If there were no words as we forgive those who trespass against us, it would be a mere claimant's outstretched hand. But this way, we have a request with a specific commitment attached - if I have not forgiven, it is tactless to ask God to forgive me.

Our Father,

Who art in Heaven,
hallowed be Thy name;
Thy Kingdom come,
Thy will be done
on earth as it is in Heaven.
Give us this day our daily bread;
and forgive us our trespasses
as we forgive those
who trespass against us;
and lead us not into temptation,
but deliver us from evil
